The program follows a polyvalent or multi-dimensional approach and is being implemented in Mamit District, where it provides vocational training across more than 60 different job roles.

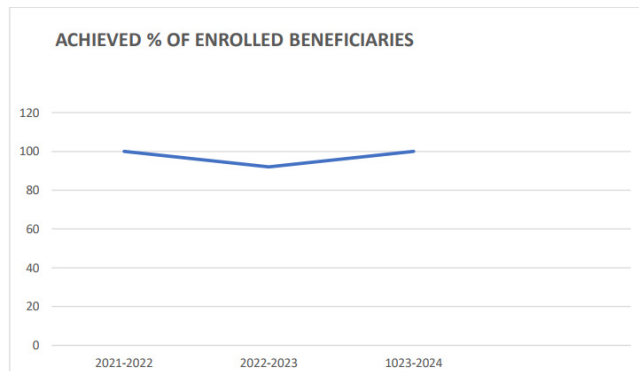
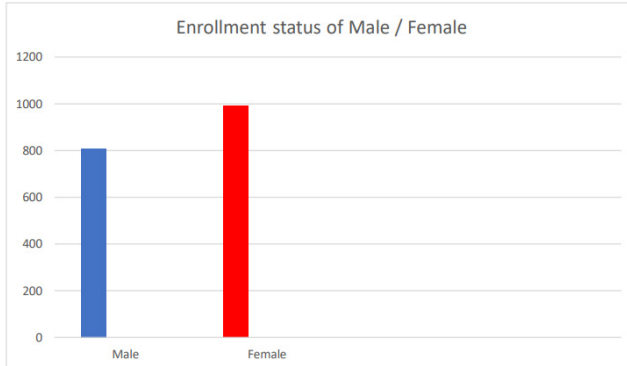
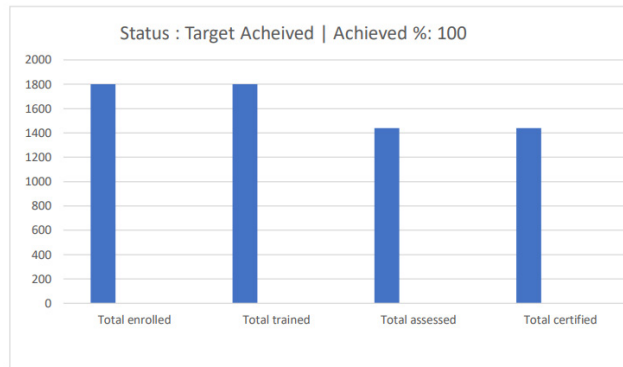

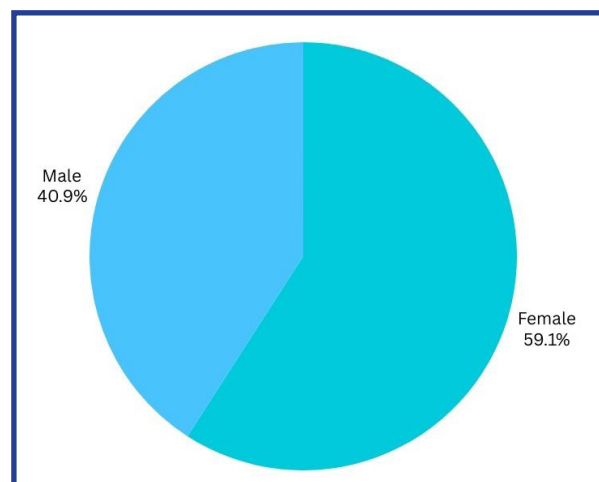
5. Skill Training Output under PM Vishwakarma

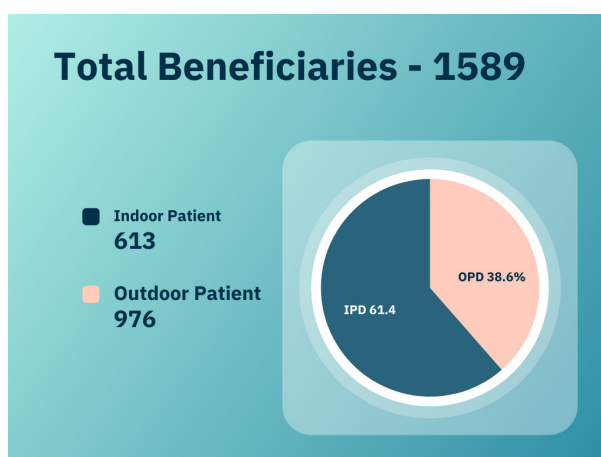
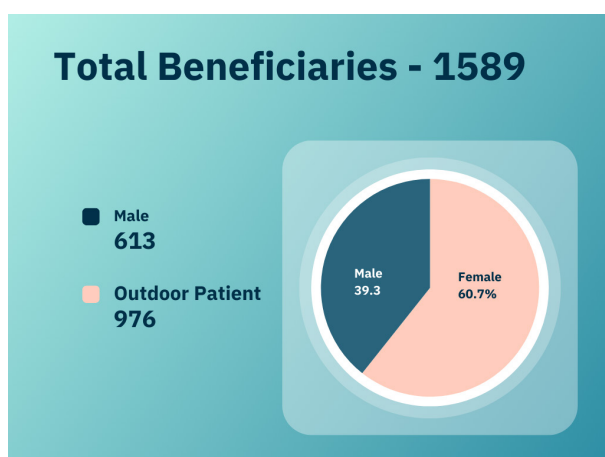
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TEN BEDDED HOSPITAL, KHAMRANG

In 2012, MFM established a Health Clinic in Khamrang Village with the approval of the Health Department, Government of Mizoram. The clinic provides healthcare services to a population of 3,086 people across five villages surrounding Khamrang.

In 2015, the Embassy of Japan in New Delhi funded the construction of a new building, which was officially inaugurated on April 4, 2016, by Mr. Akio Isomata, Economic Minister at the Embassy of Japan, alongside the Chief Minister of Mizoram. The clinic's ongoing maintenance is supported by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India.

Currently the Hospital have one part time Doctor, one Nurse and one Healthcare worker. During financial year 2023–24, a total of 24 health camps were conducted at the hospital.

MOBILE DISPENSARY, MAMIT DISTRICT

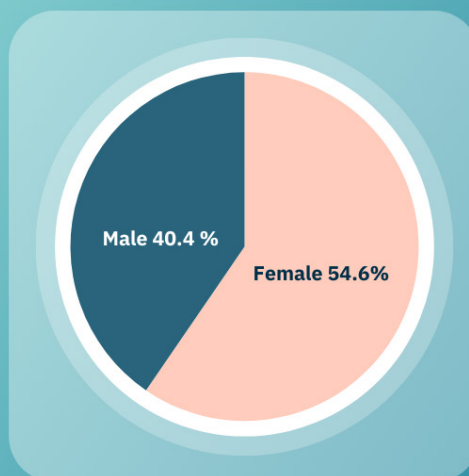
Under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, MFM received a Grant-in-Aid to run a Mobile Dispensary in Mamit District, an Aspirational District, to enhance access to affordable healthcare. This effort targets the urgent need for improved welfare services for tribal communities. By creating opportunities for socioeconomic advancement and comprehensive development of Scheduled Tribes (STs), the initiative currently involves one Medical doctor and 15 volunteers who provide accessible healthcare to some of the most remote villages in the region.

MFM SCHOOL
OF NURSING

MFM School of Nursing was founded in 2009, with approval from both the Indian Nursing Council and the Mizoram Nursing Council. In 2024, the School was upgraded to General Nursing & Midwifery (GNM). The school has an intake capacity of 20 students for ANM and 30 for GNM per batch respectively.

The School addresses the health needs of the nation, community, and individuals, laying a foundation for advanced nursing studies and specialization. It supports nurses' personal and professional growth, enabling them to contribute maximally to society as individuals, citizens, and professionals.

The Mizoram Nursing Council conducted its Annual Inspection of the School of Nursing on 11th March 2025. The inspection was carried out by two inspectors: Ma'am Lalchangliani, Tutor at the School of Nursing, Christian Hospital Serkawn, and C. Thankhumi, Retired Nursing Superintendent. Subsequently, the Indian Nursing Council (INC) Inspection was conducted by the INC Inspection Team from 11th to 12th April 2025.



A total of 65 students are currently enrolled and undergoing training during the current financial year.

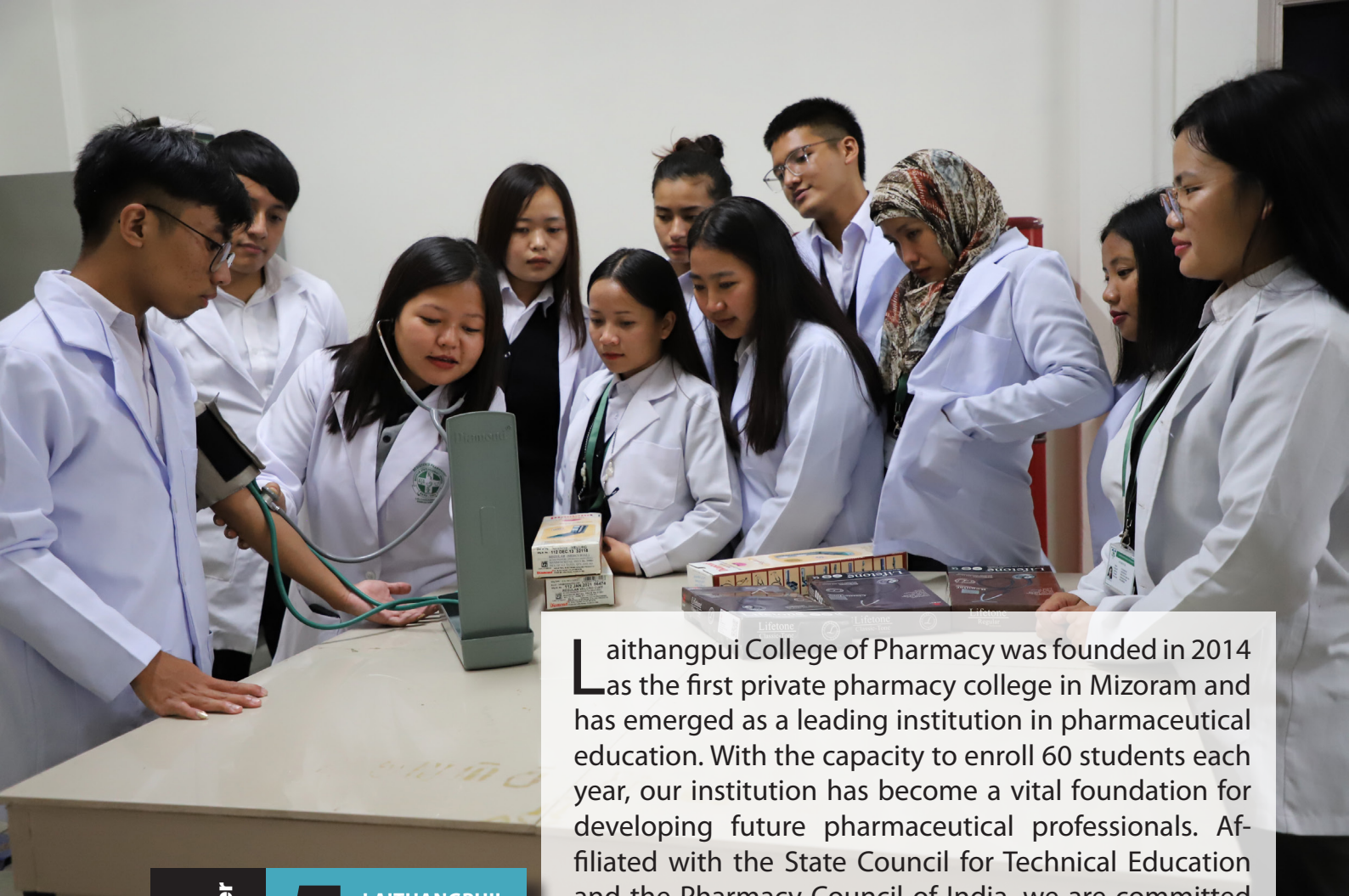

REGIONAL RESOURCE
TRAINING CENTRE
(RRTC FOR SENIOR
CITIZENS)

Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India has designated Mission Foundation Movement to be the RRTC for Age Care covering the states of Mizoram, Meghalaya, Assam and Arunachal Pradesh. As an RRTC for age care, our mandate is monitoring, providing technical support, training and capacity building for effective delivery of age care services by the NGOs funded by the Ministry. As RRTC, we also conduct advocacy, sensitization and awareness programs in the field of old age care. We interfere with state Government, local bodies, schools and colleges, senior citizens forums etc. for building linkages and networking to further the cause of age care.

The Programme aims to improve the quality of life of Senior Citizens, especially indigent senior citizen by providing basic amenities like shelter, food, medical care and entertainment opportunities and by encouraging productive and active aging through providing support for capacity building of State, Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and the community at large. RRTCs are expected to be key collaborating partners for ensuring effective implementation of the policies and programmes of the Ministry.

Under this programme, MFM cover 4 states in North East India - Mizoram, Assam, Meghalaya & Arunachal Pradesh. The Programme is 100% funded by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India.

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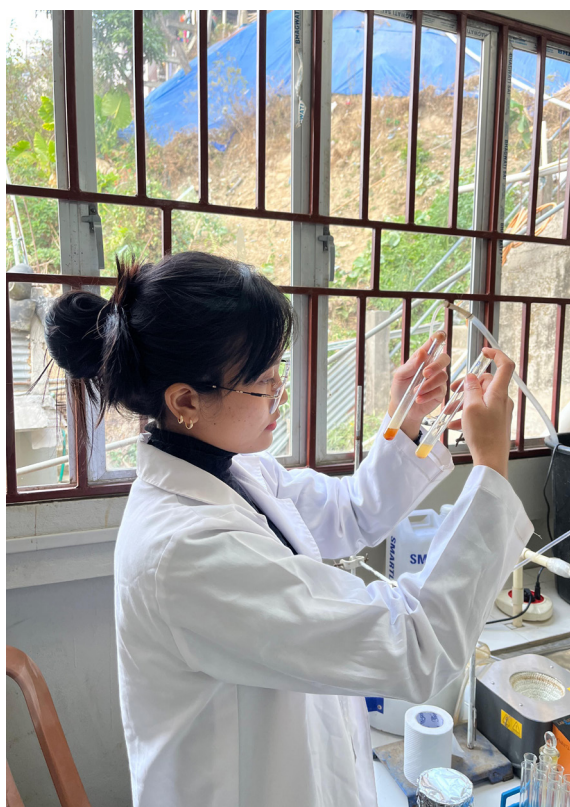
PHYTOCHEMICAL RESEARCH PROJECT

A research project is currently underway to investigate the phytochemical constituents and galactagogue properties for corms of *Colocasia esculenta* (taro) and determination of its nutritive value of the. The study involves systematic testing to assess the plant's potential health benefits and nutritional profile.

Authentication of the plant material was carried out at the Botanical Survey of India, Eastern Circle, Shillong. Preparation and extraction procedures were conducted at the LCP Laboratory, Bawngkawn, Aizawl, while proximate analysis was performed at the Mizoram Food Processing Research & Training Centre, Seling.

Taro tubers were analyzed in three processed forms: chips, powder, and boiled. The analysis followed the Ayurvedic Pharmacopoeia of India and included the following parameters:

- Moisture content
- Total ash
- Acid-insoluble ash
- Water-soluble ash
- Calorific value
- Crude protein
- Crude fat
- Crude fiber
- Carbohydrates



Qualitative phytochemical screening was conducted on root extracts using petroleum ether, chloroform, and ethanol to identify bioactive compounds with potential nutritional and medicinal properties.

Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) stands as a flagship scheme under the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE), executed by the National Skill Development Corporation. The primary objective of this Skill Certification Scheme is to empower a substantial number of Indian youth by providing industry-relevant skill training, ultimately enhancing their prospects for securing better livelihoods.



a) Central Sponsored State Monitor

Managed by the Labour, Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (LESDE) Department, Government of Mizoram, MFM has been serving as a Training Provider (TP) under this scheme since 2016. Operating across various sectors such as Healthcare, Construction, Electronics, Apparel Made-Ups and Home Furnishing, and Tourism and Hospitality, MFM is dedicated to offering comprehensive skill training and facilitating placements for candidates. The committed staff works tirelessly to ensure the best possible outcomes for the individuals enrolled in the program.

b) Special Project – Aspirational District (MAMIT)

Under the Special Project of PMKVY 4.0, which is a Central Sponsored and monitored scheme, specific attention is given to aspirational districts requiring intensive efforts to leverage India's demographic dividend. This initiative aims to eradicate poverty and provide the underprivileged sections of society with an improved chance for a life of dignity and respect.

In alignment with this vision, MFM is actively involved in Mamit, an aspirational district in Mizoram, focusing on sectors such as Tourism and Hospitality, Food Industry Capacity & Skill Initiative, Beauty & Wellness, and Electronics. By integrating villages into the developmental process, MFM aims to uplift the youth in Mamit, addressing gender bias, caste/class disparities, and economic inequalities. The scheme has proven to be a catalyst for positive change, benefiting numerous youths in Mamit and contributing to a more inclusive and empowered society

The project “Prevention of Drug Abuse Among Youth in Mizoram” was launched in 2024 in collaboration with India Collaboration. The project entails educating the younger generations about the dangers of drug abuse and identification of substance abusers, equipping them with the knowledge and life skills necessary to resist peer pressure and make informed choices.

An essential component of the project is the education and awareness campaign conducted in schools, colleges, and local communities. Workshops, seminars, and interactive sessions are organized to educate students about the psychological, physical, and legal consequences of drug use. Peer educators and former addicts are also involved in sharing real-life experiences, making the sessions more relatable and impactful.





The project aims to identify 700 individuals struggling with substance abuse in the Aizawl area, with 45% of this goal already accomplished. In terms of skill training, the target is to train 150 participants, and we have currently achieved 25% of that objective.



In collaboration with Mizoram Youth Commission (MYC), 'Aizawl Against Addiction' Awareness Campaign on Substance Abuse Prevention was conducted in five schools across Aizawl during the month of April, 2025.



The purpose of chow chow farmers coming together for sustainable farming is to enhance productivity, to find out the reason for their decline in their crops these past years and share resources and adopt eco-friendly practices. By working collectively, farmers can exchange knowledge, reduce costs through shared resources and access better market opportunities. Sustainable farming methods, such as organic fertilization and soil conservation, help maintain long term soil health and environmental balance. Additionally, organized groups can secure financial support, government aid and technical assistance more effectively. This collaboration strengthens the farming community, improves economic stability and ensures sustainable chayote cultivation for future generations





This function does not only incline the distribution of materials for farmers but for future purpose and collaboration enhances resource management, knowledge sharing and overall resilience. By coming together we can share knowledge and exchange techniques on soil health and improving efficiency and sustainability. Cooperatives or farmers groups can pool resources to afford better seeds, organic fertilizers and advanced irrigation systems. By working together, farmers can negotiate better prices, reduce exploitation by middlemen and create stable markets for chow chow crop. This special program is designed to support chow chow farmers which contributes to the overall sustainable growth of the crop by addressing key agricultural, economic and environmental challenges.

The study is conducted through a sample of 60 chayote farmers in Sihphir, Lungdai and Durtlang area through a structured questionnaire. Soil sample of individuals selected are collected in various selected location. It is estimated that there are approximately 300 chayote farming families in Sihphir area out of which 33 families from sihphir were selected and 10 families from sihphir vengthar were selected, around 30 family in Lungdai out of which 15 families were selected and 2 families from Durtlang were selected as well. Therefore, the sample size covers 60 percent of the total chayote farmers in the area under study.

This distribution of materials was attended by beneficiaries selected from 3 region, Lungdai, Sihphir and Durtlang. 60 beneficiaries were selected from these three regions and around 120 people attended the function with their family members. The distribution of Diamine phosphate (DAP) was carried out by Hon'ble Minister Pu PC Vanlalruata, Department of Agriculture, Government of Mizoram. The DAP was given to 60 beneficiaries which weight 50kgs/bag eith each bag costing Rs. 2,000.

The inaugural batch of the Elderly Caretaker Course officially commenced in the month of April, enrolling a total of 30 students. This training initiative is being offered entirely free of charge to eligible beneficiaries who are registered members of the Mizoram Building & Other Construction Workers Welfare Board (MBOCWWB). The course aims to equip participants with the necessary knowledge and practical skills required to provide compassionate and professional care to elderly individuals. By offering this program at no cost, the Welfare Board seeks to enhance the livelihoods of its members while simultaneously addressing the growing demand for trained elderly caretakers in society.

The course spans a total duration of three months, comprising two months of classroom-based theoretical instruction followed by one month of On-the-Job Training (OJT) in hospitals. This structure is designed to ensure that students gain both foundational knowledge and practical, hands-on experience in real healthcare settings.
