Introduction



Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) was established in 2004 as a Non-profit organization, registered under Mizoram Firms and Societies Act, 1960 (Extension to Mizoram Act No.3 of 1977) on 22th December, dedicated to accelerating Skill Development of Youth, Community Health, Paramedical institutions, and Community Development irrespective of tribe, caste, creed, ethnicity, or religion.

Our vision is to empower youth with prerequisite skills and knowledge creating better job opportunities for themselves and the community, improving women and child health, promotion of public health and revamping Entrepreneurship in Mizoram.

Mission Foundation Movement envisions to reach out and expand to implement community health programs and to increase quality healthcare & accessibility, improvement in child & maternity health, expansion of skill development training among youth for income generation programme and instill Entrepreneurship spirit among the younger generation.

Mission Foundation Movement aims to impact the lives of unemployed youths, non/neo literates, women and children, socially and economically backward class, start-up entrepreneurs, and at large rural community and urban poor.

MFM School of Nursing (ANM)

MFM School of Nursing was established in the year 2009 with approval from the Indian Nursing Council and Mizoram Nursing Council with an initial intake capacity of 20 seats per batch. The duration of Training is 2 years. We offer both theory and practical classes in Health Worker Training.

The students are acquainted with current skills and knowledge on medical fields boosted with professional expertise to meet the changing demand of the society.

Under the rotational plan of the school, a rural posting of Health Worker student was held at Kawnpui PHC during the month of May. We successfully conducted Home Visits, Health Awareness Campaign and Health Check-ups.

Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy

Pharmacists play a vital role in the health care system in dispensing medicines and providing latest information on various drugs. Recognising this need, Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy was started in 2014 as a unit under Mission Foundation Movement.

We offer a Diploma Course in Pharmacy with an intake capacity of 60 students each year. The Institute also conducts research and study programme on medicinal plants and food items for the safety and improvement of health standard of the people.

The College is affiliated to the State Council for Technical Education and Pharmacy Council of India. The institution is well equipped with laboratory equipments and we to believe we can make a huge impact in Pharmaceutical profession particularly in Northeast India. Students from all over the states are welcomed and encouraged.

Since 2014, we have had a total of 83 students with 20 of them now employed at various institutions across Mizoram.

MFM Community Health Clinic at Khamrang

Many villages in Mizoram do not have basic health care facilities which create a dire need of health workers, nurses and doctors in rural areas. Recognizing this need, MFM opened a Health Clinic at Khamrang Village in 2012, with the approval from the Health Department, Govt. of Mizoram, covering a population of 3086 in five villages nearby Khamrang village.

In 2015 a new building was funded by the Embassy of Japan in New Delhi. It was inaugurated by Mr Akio Isomata Economic Minister, Embassy of Japan and Chief Minister of Mizoram on 4th of April 2016. Maintenance of the clinic is funded by Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt. of India.



The clinic is a 10 bedded hospital with one delivery bed. Conducting health awareness, rendering health services, health teachings, environment and sanitation awareness programmes in the villages are the various involvements we had with the community.

We have health workers and helpers stationed here permanently and we have been able to conduct 8 free clinics at Khamrang and nearby villages during the reported period. Students from MFM School of Nursing often comes here as a part of their practical classes benefiting both the locals and the students.

Leadership & Skill Development and Vocational Training

The objective of this Programme is to increase the number of skilled workforce among the many unemployed youths in our society. We offered a 6 months training on Tailoring and three months training each on Masonry and Carpentry. We also organized a 6 months training programme on Leadership and Development.

Mental Health Awareness Campaigning / Free Clinic

Mental illness is considered a “taboo” in the society. People suffering from mental illness are often subject to discrimination. Not only this they are stormed with financial, physical, mental, emotional, and social burden. Due to which availing treatment and care becomes a hassle and even burdensome for the family members.

Affirming the need for awareness and support in providing a nurturing environment. MFM, under the National Mental Health Mission, Govt. of India organized a Target Intervention Project at Champhai District covering 125,370 populations. This Target Intervention project provides Counseling; Toll Free, Awareness Campaign, Free Clinic and Training Program.

In Mizoram, fundamental health knowledge is frequently lacking in rural regions. Families in rural areas struggle due to a lack of doctors and a lack of awareness about hygienic procedures and products. Given the needs of rural residents, Mission Foundation Movement Conducted a free clinic at the Kolasib District on 5th September, 2016 where we offered free personal hygiene kits, medical kits, and basic medical knowledge. A total of 467 patients received free medical check-ups, medicines.
