# Introduction



Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) was established in 2004 as a Non-profit organization, registered under Mizoram Firms and Societies Act, 1960 (Extension to Mizoram Act No.3 of 1977) on 22th December, dedicated to accelerating Skill Development of Youth, Community Health, Paramedical institutions, and Community Development irrespective of tribe, caste, creed, ethnicity, or religion.

Our vision is to empower youth with prerequisite skills and knowledge creating better job opportunities for themselves and the community, improving women and child health, promotion of public health and revamping Entrepreneurship in Mizoram.

Mission Foundation Movement envisions to reach out and expand to implement community health programs and to increase quality healthcare & accessibility, improvement in child & maternity health, expansion of skill development training among youth for income generation programme and instill Entrepreneurship spirit among the younger generation.

Mission Foundation Movement aims to impact the lives of unemployed youths, non/neo literates, women and children, socially and economically backward class, start-up entrepreneurs, and at large rural community and urban poor.



## HSBC Skills for life (Swades Foundation)

**H**SBC Skills for Life is a five year commitment by HSBC India that will focus on employment and entrepreneurship-linked skill development for disadvantaged youth. Under the umbrella of this programme, the Bank and Swades Foundation have forged a five-year partnership that will directly train thousands of disadvantaged youth across the country and indirectly impact and inspire many others.

MFM is selected as a Training Provider (TP) since 2017 and has been undertaking a six months training course on General Duty Assistant (GDA). We imparted training in General Duty Assistant (GDA), Healthcare Sector to enhance the capacity of rural and urban disadvantaged young women to improve their livelihood potential and provide employment opportunities. Currently, we have our centre at Aizawl with 360 target beneficiaries.

The first batch consisting of 113 GDA trainees have gone through Theory and Clinical training under funding from HSBC and monitoring by Swades Foundation. The 2nd batch of the said training course for 112 trainees also started from May 2018.



## Masonry Training Under NERLP

Under the sponsorship of North East Livelihood Programme, Ministry of DoNER, a three months course on Masonry training was organized with 60 trainees from 4th May - 9th October, 2017. Most successful trainees have received employments.





## Community Development Project Under NERLP

Community Development Programme (CDP) was launched in 2016 in collaboration with North East Rural Livelihood Projects (NERLP), Ministry of DoNER.

Under this project we covered three Community Blocks namely Tlangnuam, Aibawk and Phullen blocks. The project help create and monitor 660 Self Help Groups and 15 Federations with the aim of creating self employment under our selected trades like piggery, poultry farming, gardening, tailoring and other petty trades. More than 80% of the beneficiaries are women.





## Mental Health Programme at Champhai

Mental illness is considered a “taboo” in the society. People suffering from mental illness are often subject to discrimination. Not only this they are stormed with financial, physical, mental, emotional, and social burden. Due to which availing treatment and care becomes a hassle and even burdensome for their family members.

Affirming the need for awareness and support in providing a nurturing environment, MFM, under the National Mental Health Mission, Govt. of India organized a Target Intervention Project at Champhai District. This Target Intervention project provides Counseling; Toll Free Helplines, Awareness Campaign, Free Clinic and Training Program at Schools, Colleges, NGOs, Church Based Organizations (CBOs), Journalists Associations, etc.



## Vocational Training

Vocational Training programme on trades such as Automobiles Repairing, Apparel made-up and home furnishing, Tourism and Hospitality, Handicrafts and Health Care were undertaken for the upliftment of youth and women in particular. The successfully trainees have already benefitted by creating small business of their own.



## Leadership and skill development training

A six months course on Leadership and Skill Development Training was conducted between 4th May and 9th October, 2017 with 12 trainees belonging to the 18th batch. This course has been on-going for several years and proved to be very beneficial to young people. This year we have 12 trainees who all completed this course and most of them got employments.





## Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy

Pharmacists play a vital role in the health care system in dispensing medicines and providing latest information on various drugs. The Institute conducts research and study on various programmes for the safety and improvement of health standard of the people.

Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy was started in 2014 as one of the units under MFM affiliated under Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) and Mizoram State Council for Higher & Technical Education.

The college offers a two year Diploma Course in Pharmacy with state of the art Laboratory equipments and Hostel facilities. Currently we have a total of 83 students; 60 in the 1st year (4th batch) and 23 students in the 2nd year (3rd batch).

We have had 30 students coming from neighbouring states like Nagaland, Tripura and Sikkim. Students from all over the states are welcomed and encouraged. We believed we can make a huge impact in Pharmaceutical profession particularly in Northeast India.

## MFM School of Nursing (ANM)

Health worker plays an important role in rendering primary healthcare services in the rural areas even with minimum health care facility with the other health team members. Being the grass root healthcare provider especially for rural health, the importance of services rendered by Health worker is irrefutable.

MFM School of Nursing was established in the year 2009 with approval from the Indian Nursing Council and Mizoram Nursing Council with an intake capacity of 20 seats per batch. The duration of Training is 2 years.

Under the rotational plan of the School, our 7th and 8th batch students held a community health clinic at Khamrang, Kolasib District from 1st May - 3rd June, 2017. The students along with their tutor covered the adjoining five villages around the areas which is beneficial for both our students and the local communities.

Currently we have 24 students from 1st year (9th batch) and 20 from the 2nd year (8th batch) with few repeaters and one drop out. 5 of our students are currently sponsored by NERLP. The students faced their final examination conducted by Mizoram Nursing Council, 2017. The results are as follows:

## MFM Community Health Clinic at Khamrang

Many villages in Mizoram do not have basic health care facilities which create a dire need of health workers, nurses and doctors in rural areas. Recognizing this need, MFM opened a Health Clinic at Khamrang Village in 2012, with the approval from the Health Department, Govt. of Mizoram, covering a population of 3086 in five villages nearby Khamrang village. The clinic has been operation from our own source of fund with two staff nurses, one Health worker, one Asha and part time workers like Medical Doctor and peon/chowkdar.

MFM Nursing Students aslo come here to have their practical work which is beneficial to both the students and the local communities here.

The clinic conducts activiteis like promoting health awareness, Community Health Education, free clinics, providing freemedication. Our activites during the reported period includes;

## Free Clinic at Lunglei District

MFM encourages preventive health, balanced nutrition and child development practices in underprivileged settlements. To this effect, they have adopted a holistic approach to embrace, educating and empowering mothers and children in their social environment. Our goal is to continue improving the health and lives of the underserved who face social and financial challenges. During the reported period, Free Clinic and Health awareness campaign was conducted at 5 villages in Lunglei District. We had a total of 450 in-patients and 79 referral cases.
