Introduction



Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) was established in 2004 as a Non-profit organization, registered under Mizoram Firms and Societies Act, 1960 (Extension to Mizoram Act No.3 of 1977) on 22th December, dedicated to accelerating Skill Development of Youth, Community Health, Paramedical institutions, and Community Development irrespective of tribe, caste, creed, ethnicity, or religion.

Our vision is to empower youth with prerequisite skills and knowledge creating better job opportunities for themselves and the community, improving women and child health, promotion of public health and revamping Entrepreneurship in Mizoram.

Mission Foundation Movement envisions to reach out and expand to implement community health programs and to increase quality healthcare & accessibility, improvement in child & maternity health, expansion of skill development training among youth for income generation programme and instill Entrepreneurship spirit among the younger generation.

Mission Foundation Movement aims to impact the lives of unemployed youths, non/neo literates, women and children, socially and economically backward class, start-up entrepreneurs, and at large rural community and urban poor.

Community Development Programme (CDP)

A livelihood programme of North East Region Livelihood Programme under Ministry of DoNER, funded by World Bank have been successfully undertaken in three blocks namely Aibawk Rural Development Block, Tlangnuam Rural Development Block and Phullen Rural Development Block of Aizawl District.

The Programme looked after 669 SHGs and 15 Federation with aiming to Self Employment in Piggery, Poultry, Tailoring, Petty Trades etc.





Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy

Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy was established in 2013 and affiliated to the State Council for Technical Education and Pharmacy Council of India. The College has an intake capacity of 60 students each year. We intoduced a two year Diploma in Pharmacy course starting from 2014. The Academic session starts from August-July each year.

Pharmacists play a vital role in the health care system in dispensing medicines and providing latest information on various drugs. The institution is well equipped with laboratory equipment and we believed to make a huge impact in Pharmaceutical profession particularly in Northeast India. Students from all over the country are welcom and encouraged. The Student of the college performed its own sports in various discipline during 19-23rd November, 2018.

The College Hostel, Office and Classrooms is properly maintained and repaired and renovated. Books, Chemical and Apparatus for library and Laboratory were purchased and procured.

We also recieved inspection from Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) and Mizoram State Council for Technical Education, the examination authority of the college during the reported period.

HSBC Skills For Life (Swades Foundation)

Under the Foreign Contribution Registration Act, 2010, MFM has been funded by HSBC Skill for Life(Swadesh Foundation) to conduct and oversee a 6 months Skill Training Course on General Duty Assistant (GDA). The Course was started in 2017 with 113 trainees in the first batch (2017-18) and the second batch of 112 trainees (2018-19) successfully completing the course.

Among the successful trainees 90% have already been employed in Private Hospitals, Clinics and also worked under private employers.





Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushal Yojana(DDU-GKY), Ministry of Rural Development, Govt. of India Programme.

Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) and Mizoram State Rural Livelihood Mission signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on 7th March 2019 for conducting training of General Duty Assistant (Residential) with target of 300 trainees at Aizawl District and a target of 100 trainees of Front Line Health Worker(FLHW) in Kolasib District for a project duration of 3 years (36 months). The project is funded by Ministry of Rural Development, Govt. of India. 88 students were trained under this project in the year 2019. Training Centre at Berawtlang, Aizawl was prepared and renovated for this programme and necessary materials were procured. Training is scheduled to start from April of 2019.





MFM School of Nursing (ANM)

Health worker plays an important role in rendering primary healthcare services in the rural areas even with minimum health care facility with the other health team members.

MFM School of Nursing was established in the year 2009 with approval from the Indian Nursing Council and Mizoram Nursing Council with an intake capacity of 20 seats per batch. The duration of Training is 2 years. The students are acquainted with current skills and knowledge on medical fields boosted with professional expertise to meet the changing demand of the society.

We currently have 19 students in the 9th batch and 20 students in 8th batches respectively during the reported period of April/2018 to March/2019. Out of the total 39 students 5 are sponsored by NERLP, Ministry of DoNER and the rest are private students.



Rural Posting of the Student with their tutors is held at Khamrang Village and we observed World Diabetes Day, World Cancer Day, Nurses Day, etc. We conducted practical field visits to Remand Home, Orphanage Home, Old Age Home, and River Tlawng for learning water Purification, Aizawl Municipal Corporation Office, Dumping Ground, MULCO on pasteurization of Milk, CDPO, BPO Offices and New Secretariat Complexes etc.

The school has the following final results in the Mizoram Nursing Council Examination during 10-25th September 2018 from the 8th Batch.

Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana(PMKVY)

PMKVY is a flagship scheme of the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) implemented by National Skill Development Corporation. The objective of this Skill Certification Scheme is to enable a large number of Indian youth to take up industry-relevant skill training that will help them in securing a better livelihood.

Under the State Component of PMKVY, Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) and Labour , Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship Department, Govt. of Mizoram signed Memorandum of Understanding(MoU) on 9th July, 2018 with a validity of 31st March, 2020 (financial year of 2018-2020) for conducting Skill Development training in various trade.

Between July, 2018 and March, 2019, 60 GDAs, 30 Mason Generals and 30 Mobile Phone Repair Hardware Technician completed their training.

Start-up Village Entrepreneurship (SVEP)

The Start up Village Entrepreneurship Program (SVEP) is a sub component of Deen Dayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM) of the Ministry of Rural Development. SVEP aims to support entrepreneurs in rural areas to set up local enterprises.

This programme strives to help the rural poor come out of poverty by helping them set up enterprises and provide support till the enterprises stabilizes. The programmatic intervention addresses all three missing ecosystems – Knowledge, advisory and finance ecosystems.

As per our planning, we conduct facilitating and baseline with market potential survey in Bilkhawthlir and Thingdawl Rural Development Block in Kolasib District of Mizoram under Mizoram State Rural Livelihood Mission (MzSRLM) of Rural Development Department, Govt. of Mizoram wed March, 2019.

Mobile Dispensary/Multi Service Mobile Unit (Mamit District)

Under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, MFM received a Grant-in aid to run Mobile Dispensary at Mamit District which is an aspirational district driven by the necessity to make health care facilities more accessible and affordable.

As an Aspirational district, the community needs a great deal of extra attention to enhance the welfare of the tribals residing in this area.

This scheme helps in providing environment for socio-economic upliftment and overall development of the Scheduled Tribes (STs). Presently, there are 15 volunteers and doctors working to make health care more handy and accessible.

Rural communities experience a higher prevalence of chronic conditions than their urban counterparts. Examples of chronic conditions include heart disease, cancer, chronic respiratory disease, stroke, and diabetes. Rural communities also experience higher rates of mortality and disability than urban communities. Limited access to health promotion and disease prevention programs and healthcare services contribute to these health challenges. Considering this challenges in rural areas, MFM has organized Health Clinic in Zawlnuam, Damparengpui, West Serzawl, and Rulpuihlim villages and provide primary, preventive, and additional health services to the medically underserved sections of the community. Awareness programme on Community Health, Personal Hygiene etc. was organized on these villages

Healthcare is the right of every individual but lack of quality infrastructure, dearth of qualified medical functionaries, and lack of access to basic medicines and medical facilities thwarts its reach to 60% of population in India. Considering this fact, there is a dire need of new practices and procedures to ensure that quality and timely healthcare reaches the deprived corners of rural areas in Mizoram. To eradicate this issue, MFM has established A Community Health Clinic in Khamrang Village. In the reported period, Free Clinic has been organized at West Phaileng Village, Mamit District. During the reporting period, the activities undertaken may be categorized as follows
