Introduction



Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) was established in 2004 as a Non-profit organization, registered under Mizoram Firms and Societies Act, 1960 (Extension to Mizoram Act No.3 of 1977) on 22th December, dedicated to accelerating Skill Development of Youth, Community Health, Paramedical institutions, and Community Development irrespective of tribe, caste, creed, ethnicity, or religion.

Our vision is to empower youth with prerequisite skills and knowledge creating better job opportunities for themselves and the community, improving women and child health, promotion of public health and revamping Entrepreneurship in Mizoram.

Mission Foundation Movement envisions to reach out and expand to implement community health programs and to increase quality healthcare & accessibility, improvement in child & maternity health, expansion of skill development training among youth for income generation programme and instill Entrepreneurship spirit among the younger generation.

Mission Foundation Movement aims to impact the lives of unemployed youths, non/ neo literates, women and children, socially and economically backward class, startup entrepreneurs, and at large rural community and urban poor.

MFM School of Nursing (ANM)

MFM School of Nursing was established in the year 2009 with approval from the Indian Nursing Council and Mizoram Nursing Council with an intake capacity of 20 seats per batch. The duration of Training is 2 years.

Till date, 200 students have graduated from our Institution out of which 90 students have received employed under the States Govt. We are extremely proud to have 10 students currently working in Singapore. Others are also working as nurses and home nurses at various private hospitals across Mizoram. At present we have 12 dedicated teachers and 41 students. Last year we had a 100% pass percentage with 17 students passing in Distinction.





LAITHANGPUII COLLEGE OF PHARMACY

MFM opened Diploma in Pharmacy course in Mizoram in 2014 with the permission to admit 60 students per year. The College is affiliated to State Council for Technical Education and Pharmacy Council of India. Pharmacists play a vital role in the health care system in dispensing medicines and providing latest information on various drugs. We already have 240 graduate students even attracting students from neighboring states like Manipur, Tripura, Nagaland and Assam. At present, we have 104 students from the 1st and 2nd Semester respectively. We are confident and striving to make a huge impact in Pharmaceutical profession particularly in Northeast India.

MFM COMMUNITY HEALTH CLINIC, KHAMRANG

Many villages in Mizoram do not have basic health care facilities which create a dire need of health workers, nurses and doctors in rural areas. Recognizing this need, MFM opened a Health Clinic at Khamrang Village in 2012, with the approval from the Health Department, Govt. of Mizoram. In 2015 a new building was constructed with funding from the Embassy of Japan in New Delhi. It was inaugurated by Mr. Akio Isomata, Economic Minister, Embassy of Japan and Shri. Lal Than Hawla, Chief Minister of Mizoram on 4th of April 2016. After running the clinic on our own for several years we received funding from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs from last year which enables us to conduct monthly free clinics, Sanitization and Health Awareness Campaign.

This clinic has been utilized for rural posting of Health Worker Students from our Nursing School. We also have a new hostel building which was also completed in the month of May this year. Presently, there are 5 workers stationed here on a permanent basis.



For the past two months, this location has been used for rural placement of Health Worker students. At present, there are 5 employees. During the reporting period, the activities undertaken may be categorized as follows

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PRADHAN MANTRI KAUSHAL VIKAS YOJANA (PMKVY)

PMVKY is a flagship scheme of the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) implemented by National Skill Development Corporation. The objective of this Skill Certification Scheme is to enable a large number of Indian youth to take up industry-relevant skill training that will help them in securing a better livelihood. From the year 2017, we've been organizing a Training Provider programme (TP) under the Affiliation of National Skill Development Council, NSDC. At State we worked through Nodal Department-LESDE, where 1479 youth were professionally trained under PMKVY 2.0 We've been running an accredited Training Centre in 9 different places under different sectors like healthcare, construction, apparel made up, home furnishing and electronic courses.

Under NSDC Special Project for Mamit District, we run 4 different Training Centers in which different trade are being carried on. More than 750 trainees had successfully completed their training course.





DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA GRAMEEN KAUSHALYA YOJANA (DDUGKY)

This program is under the scheme of Ministry of Rural Development which is run by MZSRLM in the state. This program tends to provoke the knowledge of rural youth in terms of skill development and placement distinctively. In 2019 we've been selected as Project Implementing Agency (PIA).

Residential Training Course on Healthcare Sector- General Duty Assistant (GDA) was held at Berawtlang, Aizawl. The number of target was 300 out of which 187 trainees were professionally trained and 102 amongst them were given suffice employment. 55 candidates were currently employed as Patient Care Attendants in various hospitals such as City Hospital, Ebenezer Hospital, Aizawl Hospital, LRM Hospital, Trinity Hospital, and others, 33 candidates are currently employed as Patient Care Attendants in various Home Based Care, and 15 candidates were currently employed in various Pet Care Institutions. One of our trainee from the Lawngtlai District is currently working as a Missionary in Bairabi.

We also have several of our trainees who are now working oversees. 8 of our graduates are employed in Singapore as foreign domestic workers. Even one of our placed candidates from Lunglei District, who has been working as a foreign domestic worker in Singapore since 2019, used her own salary to build a home for her parents back home.

HIV/AIDS PROJECT

HIV/AIDS is a lifelong condition and currently a no cure disease. Unfortunately, Mizoram is one of the most affected areas in India. It is an issue we do not take lightly. To fight this menace MFM has partnered with I Tech (University of Washington) USA step forward to diminish the present status and improve the current situation of people infected with the disease. MFM encompass FHI 360's comprehensive approach to fighting HIV and AIDS driven by innovative research, aggregated evidence and a long track record of engaging directly with communities.

As a Project Implementing Agency (PIA), we dedicate ourselves to crafting solutions that respond to the multifaceted nature of HIV and AIDS. The project is been implemented in Kolasib and Mamit which have the highest number of people infected with the disease. We work closely with the Target Intervention (TI) NGO for the prevention and identification of key population.

We employ the 90-90-90 strategies through approaches grounded in principles of human rights, mutual respect and inclusion. HIV Project has been running from the year 2019, under the initiative taken by Fhi USA. In the following year 2020, we have been corporate with Itech. We try our utmost ability to prevent against HIV/AIDS in Mamit and Kolasib District. Awareness Campaign is mostly held against drug user. We currently have16 staff.

ALUMINIUM TRAINING ORGANIZED AMONG PRISONERS

In collaboration with Mizoram Youth Commission (MYC), a training Course in Aluminum was held at Central Jail where 50 inmates successfully completed this training course.

RHEMA FOR ASIA

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT- RAISING LYDIA PROJECT

The importance for improvement of rural women conditions and status is a well known fact. Moreover, financial dependency on family members further depreciates women's status. With the aim to economically empower women, we promote Piggery Farming over 70 women in the Rural site of Aizawl. This project was initiated from 2019. This initiative vision to increase women's self-confidence, provide better status and role in household.

In collaboration with Rhema for Asia, USA, we took initiative measures for good number of family's occupation by distributing piglet and its feed. Durtlang, Muthi, Hualngohmun, Samtlang and Muallungthu were selected in this sustainable project.







HSBC SKILLS FOR LIFE

In collaboration with Hong Kong and Shanghai Banking Corporation, India Office and Swadesh Foundation, a Competition was organized at a National level with the aid from their Company CSR fund, mainly to focus on the growth of Skill Development. We are extremely proud to be selected applicants out of thousands of competitors. We are genuinely picked to function on healthcare sector. We were given a target of 360 trainees on Health care out of which 323 were trained professionally and 69 were already settled with employment. They were mainly export to Singapore, private hospitals or as Home Nurse.





MOBILE DISPENSARY AT MAMIT

With the aid from Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt. of India, free health clinic and hearings in terms of Health teaching and community health programme was organized mainly for the people of Tuikuk tribe and vulnerable sections of the community.

We mainly focused on assisting and uplifting the backward sections of the community in terms of Health and Cleanliness, huge amount of Vitamins and Medicines were also distributed.





CENTRALISED SKILL TRAINING FOR MIGRANT WORKMEN

On February 2021, training programme was organized for the migrant worker who recently lost their job due to pandemic calamity of Covid 19. The courses include baking technician, nail technician and entrepreneurship. There were 60 certified personnel who completed this training. Each trainee was aided with stipend. This programme was completed effectively through partnership with Mizoram Youth Commission.





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DESTINATION BASED SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING

Ministry of Tourism offered a training programme in Hunar Se Rozgar and Skill Testing and Certification, CBSP scheme. There are 7 selected destinations in Mizoram in which we are also selected for this project by Tourism Department, Mizoram. We mainly function at Lunglei, Aizawl and Reiek. Baking Technician and Skill Testing Training were organized at Aizawl . Whereas, F & B Steward Service and Homestay Multi-skilled Caretaker Training were organized at Reiek. Moreover, Baking Technician, F & B Steward Service training was also held at Lunglei. There were 210 certified trainees who completed this training.





START-UP VILLAGE ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (SVEP)

National Rural Livelihood Mission, Ministry of Rural Development planned the pilot project SVEP in India. In Mizoram it was organized under the headship of MZSRLM. This project was implemented to be carried out in various chosen RD Blocks in India. We are amongst the least selected NGO. From Kolasib District, 2 RD Block such as Thingdawl RD Block and Bilkhawthlir RD Block was selected with a target of 800 beneficiaries.

This project was under Central Govt. Programme which aims at developing the skills and talents in which every member can attain their constant livelihood and occupation. Our office is located at DRDA Kolasib. There are 12 CRPEP furthermore they are monitored carefully by Mentor and Block Anchor.





JAN SHIKSHAN SHASTHAN (JSS)

Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) scheme is implemented with 100% grants from Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Government of India. Under the aegis of Mission Foundation Movement as a parent society, Jan Shikshan Sansthan is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The affairs of Jan Shikshan Sansthan are managed by respective Board of Management approved by the Government of India. The mandate of the scheme is to provide vocational and skill development programmes for non/ neo-literates and persons having rudimentary level of education up to 8th standard in both industrial/urban and rural areas and other school dropouts beyond 8th standard i.e. up to 12th standard in the age group of 15- 45 years. The priority groups are women, SC, ST, minorities and other backward sections of the society. JSSs are reaching to the unreached areas to cater the needs of the poorest of the poor. They work at the door step of the beneficiaries with a minimum infrastructure and resources.

In Mizoram, MFM is the only Organization selected to oversee and run JSS scheme by the Ministry of Skills Development & Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India. This Vocational Training will be held at Mamit District and we hope to have more JSS Institute implemented in other Districts in the near future. Skill Development NSQF 3-5 courses were planned to be conducted among 100 trainees per year.



ORGANIC FARMING FOR SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION

Organic farming is and will continue to be very important for Mizoram where Slash and Burning (Jhumming) model of agriculture is still practiced. This ancient practice is still hard to drop by Mizo farmers as it has been their main source of livelihood for generations and alternative agriculture methods by the State Govt. have not been very successful.

We have setup an office at Reiek village where we currently have three staff members. We have been providing high quality seeds, manure, organic compost, etc. and our staffs are working closely with the community by giving them relevant information and mentoring them. We also have several acres of agricultural farm land with fishery ponds. MFM initiates a model farm in order to improve the agricultural system and livelihood of the tribal's in the state. The pandemic has slowed down our projects but proposals for 150 families from Reiek and Thingsulthliah RD Block were planned to be in action.



START-UP ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPENT PROGRAMME

At Reiek RD Block we carried Entrepreneurship Development programme covering 300 Families from 21 different villages. All possible steps were taken in terms of classifying the existing and new entrepreneurs. Target allocation were planned in accordance with the population. The committee had also accordingly selected the beneficiary from the collected mobile application survey in every house. Residential training on banking, accounting, documentation and business was organized for two months under the leadership of skilled and experience trainers.


120 beneficiaries were selected from Existing Entrepreneur, 180 from New Entrepreneur. This programme was organized with collaboration from Social Welfare & Tribal Affairs Department and Ministry of Tribal Affairs. Tools and equipments are distributed to our trainees to enhance their productivity in various trades once they have completed their training under this scheme.





RELIEF AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

When the Covid Pandemic hits Mizoram we sent our R&D team to 20 villages, covering more than 700 families in Aizawl, Lunglei, Kolasib and Mamit District for distributing food stuff to people who are in need. Several of our trainees also volunteered as Covid Frontline Warriors at various locations around Aizawl city.



FREE CLINIC AT MAMIT DISTRICT

With the aid from Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt of India, free health clinic and hearings in terms of Health teaching and community health programme was organized mainly for the people of Tuikuk tribe and vulnerable sections of the community in Mamit District. We primarily focused on assisting and uplifting the underprivileged sections of the community in terms of health and cleanliness; large quantities of vitamins and medicines were also distributed to patients. During the reported period, we had approximately 1000 in-Patients. Furthermore, there are 250 patients in the referral case.
