1. MFM HEAD OFFICE:

3. LAITHANGPUII COLLEGE OF PHARMACY:

- h) Pharmacy Council of India has framed syllabus and list of prescribed equipments and apparatus under ER2020, for this our college also procures new books, apparatus, equipments and chemicals as much as possible.
- i) Compartmental Examination was held on $1^{st} 8^{th}$ December, 2021.
- j) Orientation for 1st & 2nd year Diploma in Pharmacy was held at College Auditorium on 11th October, 2021 in the presence of our Director, Mission Foundation Movement (MFM).
- k) Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy (LCP) and MFM School of Nursing participated in 5^{th} MFM Fiesta which was held on $7^{th} 10^{th}$ December, 2021.
- 1) 6th Graduation Day was held on 4th February, 2022. Due to pandemic and since public functions were prohibited, graduation was held for the outgoing students at college auditorium by the teachers and staffs of Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy.
- m) Free Clinic was conducted every month at different places within Mizoram in which Students, Teachers, Staffs and Physicians participated.
- n) College Office, classroom, Laboratories and buildings were renovated.
- o) Audit fee Bills for Electric, newspaper etc. were fully paid and there is no pending bill. All administrative cost, Bills, Annual Pharmacy Educations Regulatory Charges for affiliation for the academic session 2022-23, change in name of the institution fees, Higher & Technical Affiliation Fees were paid.

4. DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA GRAMEEN KAUSHAL YOJANA (DDU-GKY):

5. PRADHAN MANTRI KAUSHAL VIKAS YOJANA (PMKVY):

During the financial year 2021-2022, we have no target under Central component but MFM provided 3 months training course on Covid Frontline Worker under State component for 160 trainees at Aizawl and 40 trainees at Lunglei (total 200) with a stipend @Rs 125 per day. The trained Covid Frontline Worker worked free of cost at Government Covid Care Centre.

6. 10 OR MORE BEDDED HOSPITAL AT KHAMRANG KOLASIB DISTRICT:

A Community Health Centre is established with the permission of the Government of Mizoram with 5 (five) beds by MFM at Khamrang Village, Kolasib district in 2015-2016 and a suitable building is constructed with a grant received from Embassy of Japan in India and then the centre is upgraded to 10 bedded hospital with effect from 2017-2018 and funded by Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India. The 10 bedded hospital is equipped with adequate staff and indoor and outdoor patients were provided with medicines and free diet for indoor patients were also provided.

All administrative cost, bills, advertisement bills, travelling expenses, contingencies cooking charges, maintenance of building, audit fees were fully paid.

7. MOBILE DISPENSARY/ MULTI-SERVICE MOBILE CLINIC AT MAMIT, MAMIT DISTRICT:

Under the Grant-in Aid to voluntary organisation working for Scheduled Tribes the Mobile Dispensary at Mamit, covering the whole Aspirational District is funded by Ministry of Tribal Affairs since 2018-2019 till date. The Programme/ Dispensary have been benefitted by Scheduled Tribe, etc during the reported period.

8. START-UP ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT IN REIEK RURAL DEVELOPMENT BLOCK (R.D. BLOCK), MAMIT DISTRICT:

S.E.D Programme aiming to enable rural poor to set up their enterprises in its proof of concept phase, by developing a sustainable model for Rural Entrepreneurship Development through training and capacity building enterprise advisory services and to provide grant to the beneficiaries. The Programme covered the whole R.D. Block of Reiek with a target of 300 beneficiaries and existing entrepreneurs of 120 beneficiaries were covered in the previous year 2020-2021 and in the current year 2021-2022, new entrepreneurs of 180 have been provided financial assistance. The assisted beneficiaries under the programme are as under: -

9. START-UP VILLAGE ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAMME (SVEP) IN KOLASIB DISTRICT:

The Start-up Village Entrepreneurship Programme (SVEP) is a sub component of Deendayal Rural Livelihood Mission (Day- NRLM) of the Ministry of Rural Development. At present, the programme covered the whole district with as many as 800 targeted beneficiaries.

The vision of SVEP is "To help the Rural Poor come out of poverty by helping them act up enterprises and provide support till the enterprises stabilize". To provide them with business skills, exposure, loans for start-up and business support during the first critical six months of the enterprises by using the NRLM SHGs and their federations.

Out of the total target of 800 beneficiaries within four (4) years, 53 (fifty-three) existing enterprises were given loan amounting to Rs. 51,40,000 only in 2020-2021.

The main activities undertaken during the financial year 2021-2022 may be classified as follows: -

- i. Due to unforeseen circumstances, four (4) CRP-Eps resigned, BRC decided to recruit qualified CRP-RP. Any online and offline written examination was conducted for 14 applicants of these four (4) CRP-EP were selected for the areas Saipum, Saiphai, N.Chawnpui, Nisapui, Lungmuat, N.Chaltlang, N.Hlimen, Bukpui, Thingthelh, Pangbalkawn, Meidum and Chhimluang
- ii. Amrat Mahotsav was observed by MZSRLM and PIA (MFM), Deputy Commissioner of Kolasib handed or distributed a Community Enterprise Fund (CEF) amounting Rs. 39,40,000/- to 32 new and existing Entrepreneurs on 08.09.2021 of Bilkhawthlir and Thingdawl R.D. Blocks during the ceremony.
- iii. As part of the SVEP charity, BEPC/BRC Distributed 50Kgs of rice and 50 Kgs of Potato each to 9 Childrens Home and Dedication Centres on 09.12.2021.
- iv. On 1st -3rd March, 2022, Food Processing & Preservation Training was organized at SIRD Conference Hall, Kolasib with 120 participants.
- v. Community Enterprise Fund (CEF) loan amounting to Rs. 83,60,000/-was distributed to 94 beneficiaries during 2021 and CCL, KCC, Mudra Loan of Rs. 75,000 was also distributed to 07 beneficiaries.

10. HSBC SKILL FOR LIFE (SWADESH FOUNDATION):

Under the foreign Contribution Registration Act (FCRA) 2010, MFM has received Foreign Fund for General duty Assistant (GDA) Course of 3 (three) Months training. The training has been conducted Successfully within July to September 2021. Out of 58 Trainees 61.63% has been provided suitable Placement.

11. WORKING WOMEN HOSTEL AND DAY CARE CENTRE CONSTRUCTION AT DURTLANG, AIZAWL:

A construction of Working Women Hostel Building for 100 working Women and Day Care Centre for 30 Children under a sub-scheme of centrally sponsored Umbrella Scheme, mission for Protection &Empowerment under Ministry of Women and Child Development, G.O.I. has been constructed since 2019-2020 and completed on #0.01.2022. The total cost of the project is Rs 525.00 lakhs as per shares contributed as follows: -

12. M-RITE-COVID-19 VACCINATION PROGRAMME:

Momentum Routine Immunization Transformation and Equity Project was funded by United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and was awarded to Jon Snow Inc. (JSI) in 2020.

To ramp up Covid-19 Vaccination with distribution to increase demand distribution and take up Covid-19 Vaccination particularly among the vulnerable and marginalised population in Mizoram, Mission Foundation Movement is awarded to project by JSI on February,2022 as to be one among the 24 identified Sub-awardees spread across various States in India.

MFM covers four Rural Development Blocks of Kolasib and Mamit District as under:-

14. JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN (JSS):

The Central Government has opened 52 new JSS in different districts of India in 2021. Among them is Mamit District, an aspirational district in Mizoram. JSS Mamit started functioning on 1st October, 2021. The office is located at Chhim veng, Mamit and currently there are 7 staff members. The target allocation for October 2021 to March 2022 was 900. We have taken up 11 job roles during this time period for which trainings were provided by 18 trainers. The course, duration, number of beneficiaries and job roles are mentioned below:

15. ORGANIC FARMING FOR SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE PRODUCTION:

The pandemic hampers normal lifestyle including food Production and Vegetables supply chain. To mitigate this Ministry of Tribal Affair Govt of India and Social Welfare Dept selected Mission Foundation Movement as a Project Implementing Agency to promote self-sufficient in agricultural Products through organic farming was initiated at Thingsulthliah and Reiek RD block.

For selection of beneficiaries, A project Approval Committee was formed at the Block level under the Chairmanship of Block Development Officer (BDO). Project Implementing Agency PIA then requested BDO office to make a shorted list beneficiary from Self Help Group members. Among shortlisted SHG verified by Project Staff on the spot, the Project Approval Committee selected 150 SHG for the beneficiaries under Organic Farming Project.

The Training of the Farmers was conducted with cluster of adjacent villages with a Maximum of 35 only. The Training was imparted to the farmers in various fields Green manuring, method of vermicomposting, water use efficiency, post-harvest management, integrated Disease and Pest Management. The trainings were conducted in field conditions and therefore completed during the dry period and when most of the farmers do not have heavy farm activities.

The greenhouse with a dimension of 20m x 5m to five villages in Reiek RD Block and Thingsulthliah RD Block which would be utilized and taken care-off by the Self-Help Group members. The selection of these villages was solely undertaken by MzSRLM RD Block, Organic Farming Project had on the spot verification. Construction of these greenhouses was duly completed on 31st March 2022

The beneficiaries who completed their training courses were given Certificate of appreciation, Rs. 3,000 and Support Equipment like, Hoes, Shovels, Spades, Water Pipes and Organic Seeds like Sweet corn (vaimim), Bean and Ladies Fingers (Okra) seeds to under Organic Farming for Sustainable Agriculture Production Project.
