About MFM

Mission Foundation Movement was established in 2004 as a non-profit organization by its founder and current Director, R. Vanlalzauva.

In its early years, MFM focused on tackling the prevalent issues of drug and alcohol abuse among Mizo youth, as well as the shortage of employment opportunities. The organization established rehabilitation and counseling centers for those dealing with substance abuse and provided vocational training and skill development programs, enabling individuals to rebuild their lives and pursue new opportunities for a fresh start.

Today, MFM operates across Mizoram, implementing a range of development programs in areas like skill development, entrepreneurship, women's empowerment, rural healthcare, and support for senior citizens.

MFM is deeply committed to generating employment opportunities for youth both locally and internationally. Recently, the organization has also taken a leading role in supporting refugee rehabilitation within the state, collaborating with various organizations to provide essential relief and assistance.

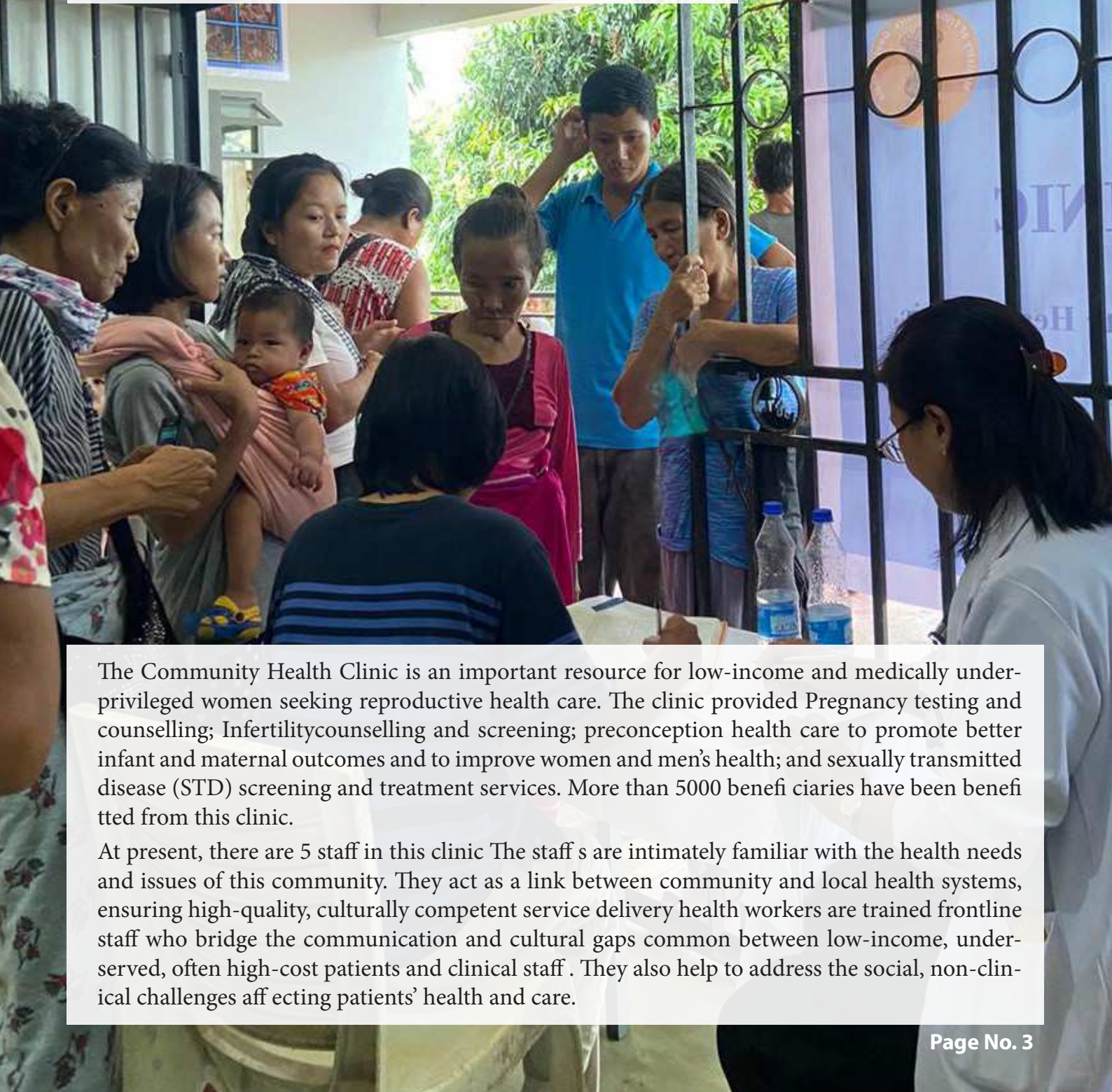
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10 bedded Hospital, Khamrang

Many villages in Mizoram do not have basic health care facilities which create a dire need of health workers, nurses and doctors in rural areas. Recognizing this need, MFM opened a Health Clinic at Khamrang Village in 2012, with the approval from the Health Department, Govt. of Mizoram, covering a population of 3086 in five villages nearby Khamrang village.



The Community Health Clinic is an important resource for low-income and medically underprivileged women seeking reproductive health care. The clinic provided Pregnancy testing and counselling; Infertility counselling and screening; preconception health care to promote better infant and maternal outcomes and to improve women and men's health; and sexually transmitted disease (STD) screening and treatment services. More than 5000 beneficiaries have been benefited from this clinic.

At present, there are 5 staff in this clinic. The staff are intimately familiar with the health needs and issues of this community. They act as a link between community and local health systems, ensuring high-quality, culturally competent service delivery. Health workers are trained frontline staff who bridge the communication and cultural gaps common between low-income, under-served, often high-cost patients and clinical staff. They also help to address the social, non-clinical challenges affecting patients' health and care.

Mobile Dispensary

Under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, MFM received a Grant-in aid to run Mobile Dispensary at Mamit District which is an aspirational district driven by the necessity to make health care facilities more accessible and affordable. As an Aspirational district, the community needs a great deal of extra attention to enhance the welfare of the tribal's residing in this area.

This scheme helps in providing environment for socioeconomic upliftment and overall development of the Scheduled Tribes (STs). Presently, there are 15 no of volunteers and doctors working to make health care more handy and accessible.



During the FY 22-23, a total of 1648 patients received medical treatment through this initiative. Of these, 756 were male and 892 were female, with 760 patients under the age of 18.

MOMENTUM Routine Immunization Transformation and Equity (MRITE)



MOMENTUM Routine Immunization Transformation and Equity (MRITE) is involved in assisting Mizoram with the rollout of the COVID-19 vaccine. Since March 2023, the project has been supporting Routine Immunization by applying the lessons learned from the COVID-19 vaccination campaign to improve the uptake of routine vaccines. MFM began implementing the MRITE project in February 2022 in two districts—Mamit and Kolasib—and later expanded it to Lunglei District, covering nine blocks across all three districts.

DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA GRAMEEN KAUSHALYA YOJANA (DDUGKY)

This initiative is part of the Ministry of Rural Development's scheme, overseen by MZS-RLM within the state. The program is designed to enhance the skills of rural youth and improve their employment opportunities through focused development and placements.

MFM has been chosen as a Project Implementing Agency (PIA) for 2019. General Duty Assistant (GDA) Residential Training Course on Healthcare Sector had been held in Berawtlang, Aizawl.

We successfully trained 300 of our entire targets, 299 candidates completed their assessments, of whom 288 candidates were successfully certified, 1 application dropped out just prior to the examination, and 150 of them were provided adequate employment.



The institution has successfully placed students abroad, assigning them to various hospitals and roles as Home-Based Attendants or Patient Care Attendants, where they provide vital care to seniors, dementia patients, and others in need. Furthermore, candidates have been placed internationally in locations like Singapore and Hong Kong, with three students notably employed in Singapore since 2019.

START-UP VILLAGE ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAMME (SVEP)

SVEP is a sub-project under Mizoram State Rural Livelihoods Mission (MzSRLM). As an empanelled Project Implementation Agency (PIA), we started implementing it from 2019. This project is taken up in two districts of Mizoram – Kolasib and Serchhip. This project duration is 4 years starting from November 2019.



SVEP in Kolasib District has a total target of 800 enterprises to be set up within these 4 years. These 800 enterprises is split into 400 start-up enterprises and 400 existing enterprises. Under SVEP, there is community enterprise fund (CEF) for entrepreneurs to avail as loan. CEF loan provided under SVEP were monitored regularly through spot verification and also success story of these entrepreneurs are collected and sent to National Rural Livelihoods Mission.



Entrepreneurs under SVEP are provided necessary skill development training like Baking Technician Training and Food Processing & Preservation Training. More skill based training will be provided in the future as per the demands of the entrepreneurs. Food Court was also set-up by these entrepreneurs during Regional SARAS FAIR 2022 at Aizawl and SARAS Ajeevika at Noida.

JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN

Among the 304 Jan Shikshan Sansthans (JSSs) established nationwide, JSS Mamit is one such institution, inaugurated on October 1, 2021, with Mission Foundation Movement as its parent organization. Its mission is to offer vocational training in a non-formal format to non-literate individuals, neo-literates, and those with foundational education, aged 15 to 45. The program focuses on women, Scheduled Tribes, minorities, and other disadvantaged groups. JSSs extend their reach to underserved regions, addressing the needs of the poorest populations with minimal infrastructure and resources, providing services directly to the beneficiaries.

As part of our ongoing project, we are pleased to report that 840 beneficiaries, representing 93.3% of the target, have successfully enrolled and are now actively participating in training programs aimed at developing the necessary skills for various job roles. Training is also ongoing for 40 additional beneficiaries in the Assistant Dress Maker and Welder and Fabricator categories, although they are yet to be enrolled in the portal.

To ensure accessibility and convenience, several training centers have been established across the region, including West Phaileng, Rawpuichhip, Zawlnuam, Kawrthah, Khawrihnim, and our main center in Mamit. Training sessions are being conducted concurrently at all these locations.



Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana 4.0 (PMKVY 4.0), Skill Hub

A flagship scheme of the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) implemented by National Skill Development Corporation, the objective of this Skill Certification Scheme is to enable a large number of Indian youth to take up industry-relevant skill training that will help them in securing a better livelihood.

Our dedicated staffs work extensively to endow the best skills and placement for the candidates. The special project under PMKVY 4.0 is a Central Sponsored Central Monitor scheme which specially focused on aspirational districts that need intensive attention to leverage India's demographic dividend. It aims to eliminate poverty and offer the underprivileged section of the society a better chance to live a life of dignity and respect.

As an attempt to integrate villages into the development process of the country, MFM works with Mamit, an aspirational district in Mizoram under these sectors:

Nail Technician
Small Poultry Farming
Pickle Making technician
Electrical Technician

BENEFICIARIES

There are a total of 30 trainees under each sectors with the target being 60 trainees each per sector. A number of youths in Mamit had benefited from this scheme redressing inequalities based on gender bias, caste/class, and economic disparities.



Skill Acquisition and Knowledge Awareness for Livelihood Promotion (SANKALP)

Skill Acquisition and Knowledge Awareness for Livelihood Promotion (SANKALP) is a programme of the Ministry of Skill Development with loan assistance from the World Bank. It aims to improve short term skill training qualitatively and quantitatively through strengthening institutions, bring in better market connectivity and inclusion of marginalised sections of the society. SANKALP was launched on 19th January 2018 and has a tenure till March 2023.



Under SANKALP programme, Horticulture Department, Mamit proposed a skill development project for implementation in Mamit District named “Short Term Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Training of Youth for Livelihood Promotion in Horticulture Crops”.

Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) implemented Skill Development Training at Mamit and Reiek under the umbrella of Mamit DC. The project focuses on promoting Mizoram products to encourage local artisans and promote value addition in existing products, items and to introduce innovative products/handicrafts using the locally available resources, raw materials like bamboos.

REGIONAL RESOURCE TRAINING CENTRE (RRTC) FOR SENIOR CITIZEN

Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India has designated Mission Foundation Movement to be the RRTC for Age Care covering the states of Mizoram, Meghalaya, Assam and Arunachal Pradesh.



As an RRTC for age care, our mandate is monitoring, providing technical support, training and capacity building for effective delivery of age care services by the NGOs funded by the Ministry. As RRTC, we also conduct advocacy, sensitization and awareness programs in the field of age care. We interfere with state Government, local bodies, schools and colleges, senior citizens forums etc. for building linkages and networking to further the cause of age care.

A total of six programme were conducted during the Financial Year 2022-2023 i.e. Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizen Act, 2007 at Durtlang and Bawngkawn, Mizoram on 9th and 10th March 2023, Three days training programme on Basic Geriatric Care at Durtlang on 14th – 16th March, Three days training programme on Geriatric Counseling at Zemabawk on 21st – 23rd March 2023, Three days training programme on Dementia Care/Management at Lungbial on 21st – 23rd March, 2023.

In addition, a three months certificate course for Geriatric Caregivers Course is open at Bawngkawn with an intake capacity of 25 students in each batch.

Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM)

Employment through Skill Training & Placement (EST&P) Component under NULM funded by Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs is designed to provide skills to the unskilled urban poor as well as to upgrade their existing skills. The programme provide for skill training of the urban poor to enable them setting up self-employment ventures and for salaried jobs in the private sector. The EST&P Programme intends to fill the gap between the demand and availability of local skills by providing skill training programmes as required by the market.

Running affiliated & accredited three Training Centers at Serchhip, Lunglei, Mamit and Aizawl providing Job Roles on Baking Technician, Self Employed Tailor and General Duty Assistant.

The broader objective of the Employment through Skills Training & Placement (EST&P) Programme is –

- To provide an asset to the urban poor in the form of skills for sustainable livelihood.
- To increase the income of urban poor through structured, market-oriented certified courses that can provide salaried employment and / or self-employment opportunities which will eventually lead to better living standards and alleviation of urban poverty on a sustainable basis
- Ensure inclusive growth with increased contribution of skilled urban poor to the National Economy.



General Duty Assistant (GDA) Course

under Labour, Employment, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Department (LESDE), Govt. of Mizoram

The programme aims at meeting the rising demand of GDA in healthcare settings by enhancing knowledge to Mizoram Building & Other Construction Workers Welfare Board (MBOCWBB) members and their families through a short duration skill based training programme with an objective to impart knowledge to the trainees which will enable them to be employed by hospitals and healthcare facilities to provide support to nurses, doctors as well as other healthcare team members in ensuring quality care to the patients under the department of Labour, Employment, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Mizoram.



Classes for the first batch started on 17th of May with a total of 30 students. On 26th October, certificates were distributed to 29 successful trainees from the first batch by Chief guest, Pi Angela Zothanpuui, Director LESDE.

MFM Relief Programme for Myanmar Refugees



MFM Relief Programme for Myanmar Refugees’ has been providing relief for Myanmar refugees who are settling in various Relief Camp within Mizoram since 2022. MFM has been collaborating with Chin Humanitarian Aid International and Nations UK for this project. The Project currently covers Refugee camps near- by Aizawl namely: Sihhmui, Durtlang, Sairang, Ngalchawm, Tuirial and Khamrang. Currently, MFM employs a project coordinator (Myanmar National) who visits Refugee camps on a monthly basis. MFM is also on a constant lookout for likeminded organizations willing to collaborate to a widen our relief program.

During FY 2022-23, MFM distributed supplies to Thaizawl Refugee Camp (19th August, 2022) and Ngalchawm Refugee Camp (25th March, 2023)

Laithangpui College of Pharmacy

Laithangpui College of Pharmacy, established in 2014, stands as a beacon of excellence in pharmaceutical education. With the privilege to admit 60 students annually, our institution has become a cornerstone in shaping the future of pharmaceutical professionals. Affiliated with both the State Council for Technical Education and the Pharmacy Council of India, we uphold the highest standards of education and practice.

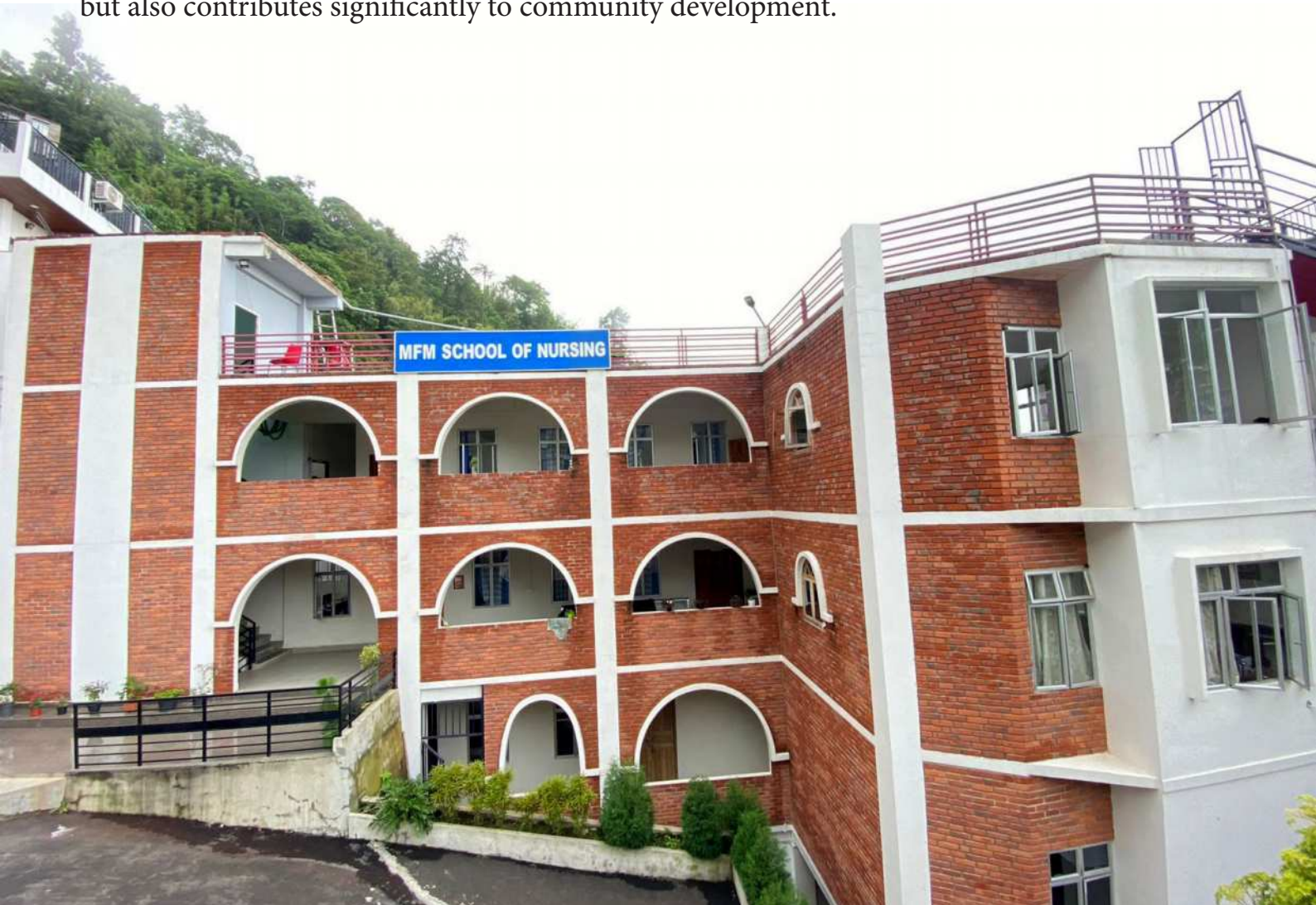

MFM School of Nursing

MFM School of Nursing, established in 2009 with affiliations from the Indian Nursing Council and the Mizoram Nursing Council, holds a significant role in shaping the future of youths by imparting occupational skills and knowledge across various domains. The founder's clear vision was instrumental in establishing a platform that not only focuses on academic excellence but also contributes significantly to community development.



The school shifted to its new campus at Durtlang North in 2022 with hostel facilities. Currently the Institution has 9 teaching and non teaching staffs and continues to uphold its commitment to nurturing talent and serving the community at large. Governed by the MFM board of executives, the school is committed to engaging in diverse community development programs such as Community Health, Livelihood Promotion, Skill Development, Women Empowerment, HIV /AIDS, Para – Medical Course.

MFM School of Nursing

A total of 40 students are currently enrolled in the ANM training program at MFM School of Nursing, distributed as follows: 21 students in the 13th batch and 19 students in the 14th batch.

The school has successful academic results in the Mizoram Nursing Council Examination held in September, 2022 for the 12th and 13th Batch. The College had a 100 percent pass record among the 12th batch while 13 students passed from the 13th batch.

On 3rd February, 2023, 14th Capping and Lamp Lighting Ceremony was organized at the School Auditorium. Pu Lalrinenga Sailo, Mayor AMC was the Chief Guest and Mrs. C. Lalramdini was the Capper and Lamp Lighter.





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
