WORLD MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS (MS) DAY OBSERVED AT PHARMACY COLLEGE



World Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Day was commemorated with a special event held at the Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy Auditorium. The program was jointly organized by the National Institute for Locomotor Disabilities – Regional Training Centre, Aizawl, Mizoram, and the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India.

As part of the event, Dr Muhammed Azzarudin, Head of department, Physiotherapy, RIPANS, served as the resource person and delivered a lecture on the characteristics of sclerosis. The program was organized with the objective of increasing public awareness about Multiple Sclerosis—a long-term neurological disorder that impacts the



central nervous system—and to inform attendees about its symptoms, associated challenges, and available treatment methods.

According to the Multiple Sclerosis International Federation, over 2.3 million people worldwide are affected by Multiple Sclerosis. In recognition of this, the Federation has designated May 30th as World Multiple Sclerosis Day to raise global awareness about the condition.

PM VISHWAKARMA SCHEME MEETING HELD AT MAMIT DC OFFICE



Mamit, May 7, 2025 — A crucial meeting on the implementation of the PM Vishwakarma Scheme was convened at the Deputy Commissioner's Office in Mamit on Tuesday. The meeting aimed at sensitizing Block Development Officers (BDOs) from across Mamit District about the objectives and operational strategies of the scheme. The session was conducted through video conferencing, facilitated by the staff of Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) and hosted via the National Informatics Centre (NIC). The meeting was chaired by Pi. Carolyn L.B. Khiangte, Additional Deputy Commissioner, alongside Pi. Grace Lalremdiki Sailo, Sub-Divisional Officer (SDC), who together coordinated the proceedings and engaged participants in constructive discussions.

During the session, JSS officials provided detailed presentations on the scope of the PM Vishwakarma Scheme, highlighting the importance of supporting traditional artisans and craftsmen through skill development, financial assistance, and recognition. The BDOs were encouraged to actively collaborate in identifying beneficiaries and facilitating program implementation at the grassroots level.

ACTION PLAN FOR 2025–2026 APPROVED

Action Plan for the financial year 2025–2026 was officially approved by the Central Ministry. This milestone marks a major step forward in rolling out structured and impactful activities under JSS Mamit. The approval will enable the district to initiate various training, awareness, and livelihood enhancement programs tailored to the needs of local artisans in the coming year.

The meeting concluded with a renewed sense of commitment among all stakeholders to ensure the successful implementation of the PM Vishwakarma Scheme in Mamit District, thereby contributing to the empowerment and sustainability of traditional skills and rural livelihoods.

INSPECTION VISIT FROM WOMEN & CHILD DPT.

On 29th May, an inspection team from the Department of Women and Child Development visited the MFM main office to assess progress on two innovative projects currently underway. The first project, "Chow Chow Cultivation for Sustainable Farming in the Sihphir Region," aims to promote eco-friendly agriculture and boost rural livelihoods. The second, a scientific initiative titled "Phytochemical Screening and Nutritional Analysis of Colocasia esculenta (Taro) with Emphasis on its Galactagogue Potential," explores the medicinal and dietary benefits of taro.



During the visit, Project Coordinators HL Rinawma and Lalmuanpuii delivered a detailed presentation highlighting key milestones, community engagement efforts, and the broader vision behind each initiative. The team emphasized how the projects intertwine traditional knowledge with scientific innovation to foster sustainability and maternal health in the region.

A state-level orientation programme for the Mobius Young Climate Leaders for Himalayan Development Project was successfully conducted at the MFM main office on May 3rd. The event marked a significant step in preparing the Mizoram team for their upcoming involvement in this climate-focused initiative.

The orientation was facilitated by the visiting Mobius team from Nagaland, led by Ms. Nuneseno Chase, Director, and Mr. Vipito Achumi, a Development Professional with Mobius. The session provided valuable insights into the objectives, strategies, and expectations of the project, aimed at empowering young climate leaders across the Himalayan region.





As part of the next phase, the Mobius team from Mizoram is scheduled to undergo intensive training in Nagaland from June 18th to 20th. The training will focus on building climate leadership capacity among youth, with an emphasis on local climate issues, sustainable practices, and community engagement.

The Mobius Young Climate Leaders for Himalayan Development Project is spearheaded by the Climate Studies and Knowledge Solutions Centre under the Government of Nagaland. It is supported by the Department of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, the Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE), and Hearth Advisors.

This initiative represents a collaborative effort to equip young leaders in the Himalayan region with the knowledge and tools necessary to address the growing challenges posed by climate change.
