



The Minister expressed appreciation, saying it was commendable to have such a research report on Iskut. He pointed out that this study is only a beginning, and the government will continue consultations with farmers to develop plans for improvement. He also mentioned that KVK Selesih will continue to provide useful services for farmers.



Project Coordinator HL Lalrinawma presented the report. He stated that Durtlang, Sihphir, and Lungdai areas used to produce Chow Chow in large quantities. However, over the past 10 years, cultivation has steadily declined, and the trend appears to be continuing. The Project Coordinator also presented several recommendations for necessary interventions.





A certificate distribution programme for 45 trainees who completed healthcare sector training under the Mizoram Building & Other Construction Workers Welfare Board, LESDE Department, was held at the LESDE Conference Hall.

Certificates were handed over by Mr. John Tanpuia, Director of LESDE Department, who encouraged the trainees to embrace a spirit of service as they step into healthcare professions. He noted the growing demand for skilled workers worldwide and highlighted the government's ongoing efforts to promote skill development both within India and abroad. He also mentioned the state's initiatives to strengthen vocational training alongside academics, with various courses being offered through District ITIs. Out of the 45 trainees, 14 have already secured jobs in private hospitals and as home-based caregivers, five are undergoing Japanese language training in preparation for employment in Japan, and eight are preparing for placements in Singapore.








Health and General Camp under the scheme of SAMP RNA Suraksha Kendra was organized by the staff of Samaritan Society, Mamit on 28th June 2025,

MFM Executive Director was invited at a one-day state-level workshop titled "Bridging the Skill Gap: Enhancing Employability in Mizoram" held on 8th August 2025 at Aijal Club, Mizoram, organized by UGC Malaviya Mission Teacher's Training Centre, Mizoram University. The workshop aimed to address the growing skill gap among the youth and explore strategies to enhance employability in the state.

It featured expert talks, panel discussions, and networking sessions with notable speakers such as Prof. Santosh Mehrotra Visiting Prof, University of Bath, UK; Mr. Lalramchhuangzela, Executive Director, Mission Foundation Movement; Mr. Alan Lalhriatpuia, Chief Executive Officer, Lailen Consulting and Mr. Jervis Nghaka, Founder of Jay Jay Training and Placement Solutions.

The workshop addressed critical skill gaps hindering youth employability in Mizoram. Key stakeholders—students, educators, policymakers, industry, and academic professionals—identified major gaps in soft skills, digital literacy, and technical expertise. A significant consensus emerged on the critical need for demand-driven skill programs, modernized curricula that incorporate practical training, and strong industry-academic engagement.
