In this context, the Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) is poised to take on a significant role in the state of Mizoram, particularly in the areas of poverty alleviation and livelihood promotion. With its longstanding commitment to empowering tribal and rural communities, MFM is expected to contribute meaningfully to the implementation of locally-driven, climate-resilient livelihood initiatives that align with the broader goals of sustainable development and environmental justice.
