## GENERAL DUTY ASSISTANT (GDA) COURSE

Classes for the First Batch of General Duty Assistant (GDA) was started on 17<sup>th</sup> of May, 2023 at MFM Complex Durtlang with 30 students. Each batch will undergo a three months residential course on General Duty Assistant with Miss Lalmalsawmi, B.Sc (N) recruited as a trainer.

Theory and practical classes are conducted from Monday to Friday from 10 am to 3 pm. Following theory block, students will be posted in Hospital as a part of their educational programme.



### About the programme

The programme aims at meeting the rising demand of GDA in healthcare settings by enhancing knowledge to Mizoram Building and Other Construction Welfare Board (MBOCWB) members and their families through a short duration skill based training programme with an objective to impart knowledge to the trainees which will enable them to be employed by hospitals and healthcare facilities to provide support to nurses, doctors as well as other healthcare team members in ensuring quality care to the patients under the department of Labour, Employment, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Mizoram. The Programme is 100% funded by Labour, Employment, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (LESDE) Department, Govt. of Mizoram.

### Geriatric Caregiver Course

The activity for the month of May is based on conducting class test weekly and other out of classroom learning experience. Students were made to give weekly test to evaluate their knowledge on selected topics. An online quiz forum was also created to test their knowledge on all the topics being covered and the students seemed to enjoy it and it is a good learning strategy for revisions.

A fun game activity was being conducted once a week at the end of classes and this enables the students to participate freely and willingly in other practical classes and it is found to have an impact on bringing out their potential.

On 31st May half the day was spent on work education and the students worked on cleaning and rearranging the lab room and they were being given directions on how to correctly handle the equipments.

On the other hand, she has unutilized skill of pickle making. She realized that pickle making is suitable for profit making activity. She started making pickles from her own house, participate in various Fairs and Trades. She then participated in Entrepreneurship Competition and win numerous award. She was selected as an existing entrepreneur under Start-up Entrepreneurship development Programme for her performance. She then selected as the winner from among 120 existing candidates.

C. Rinsangpuii was attending residential training programme conducted by MFM on subjects such as Business Management, Accounting, and Marketing etc. She learn new things from the training and improve the quality of her business. After completing the training she was given equipment to support her business. The training and equipment we provide has helped her to improve her business, and raised the status of their family. She is very grateful to MFM for providing her with the assistance materials to improve his livelihood.

## ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Honorable Finance Minister initiated the idea of Start-up village entrepreneurship programme (SEDP) in the Budget session of 2014-15 on July 10th, 2014. The project will provide assistant to existing enterprises at the same time encourage development of new enterprises.

SEDP aims to benefit the households and communities even beyond the financial gains it provides. It seek to help rural people specially the marginalized sections, women, and SC and ST communities to gain a sense of dignity and self-reliance leading to great social changes. The overall objective of SEDP is to implement the Government's efforts to stimulate economic growth and reduce poverty and unemployment in the villages by helping start and support rural enterprises. The project was implemented at Reiek RD Block covering 21 villages with 300 beneficiaries
