Final Examinations for Pharmacy Students

1st and 2nd year students of Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy faced their final examination from 19th June and will finish on 21st July 2023. The exam is conducted by Higher & Technical Education, Mizoram. The current academic session will end on 21st July, 2023. Whereas, new academic session for the year 2023-2024 will be starting from 16th August, 2023. Applicants for new batch for 2023-2024 session faced personal interview on 5th and 6th July, 2023. Results for personal interview was declared on 7th July, 2023. For selected candidates, admission is open till 19th July, 2023

Mobile Dispensary at Mamit District

Mobile Dispensary and free clinic was organized at Damdiai, Chuhvel and Chhippui villages of Mamit District on the 13th and 16th June respectively with a total of 133 patients recieving treatment and medicines for free. There were 39 children (below 18 years of age) and 25 patients above the age of 70.

The Medical team comprise of Dr. Franky Lalsangzuala, staffs from MFM School of Nursing and Pharmacy students form Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy. Presently, there are 15 no of volunteers and doctors working to make health care more handy and accessible.

As an Aspirational district, the community needs a great deal of extra attention to enhance the welfare of the tribal's residing in this area. This scheme helps in providing environment for socioeconomic upliftment and overall development of the Scheduled Tribes (STs).


RI VACCINATION AT MAMIT DISTRICT

On the other hand, she has unutilized skill of pickle making. She realized that pickle making is suitable for profit making activity. She started making pickles from her own house, participate in various Fairs and Trades. She then participated in Entrepreneurship Competition and win numerous award.

She was selected as an existing entrepreneur under Start-up Entrepreneurship development Programme for her performance. She then selected as the winner from among 120 existing candidates.



Restaurant cum Hotel making is the family's livelihood of Benjamin Malsawmkima. The restaurant has been in operation for over 5 years. After completing class XII standard he undergo Hotel Management Training. After completing the course he helped his parents in their business. He has already managed the family's livelihood. He can earn Rs 15000 approximately in a month. He was selected as an existing Entrepreneur under Start-up Entrepreneurship Development Programme.

He was trained by MFM on subjects related to Business Management, Accounting, Marketing etc. In addition to training, equipment was provided to support his employment. The training and equipment we provide has helped him to improve his employment, and raised the status of their family. With the equipment provided by the project he can serve more people and produced more products and expand his business. The family income has increased to Rs 25000 per month. He thanked MFM and Social welfare Department for raising him to this level.



JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN (MAMIT)

I. Assessments Conducted on 7th June:

On 7th June, assessments were conducted for the Assistant Beauty Therapist and Bamboo Handicraft courses. The assessment for Assistant Beauty Therapist took place at Khawrihnim, while the assessment for Bamboo Handicraft was held at Rejek RD block.

II. Assessments Conducted on 9th June:

On 9th June, assessments were conducted for the Welder and Fabricator, Assistant Wireman, and Electrical Technician courses. The assessments for Welder and Fabricator took place at Kawrtethawveng, while the assessment for Assistant Wireman and Electrical Technician was held at Kanhmun.

III. Assessment on Assistant Beauty Therapist:

Another assessment for the Assistant Beauty Therapist course was conducted on 22nd June at JSS Mamit.

IV. Distribution of Broiler Chicks:

On 20th June, the JSS staffs distributed 9 broiler chicks to the beneficiaries of the PMKVY 4.0 Backyard Poultry Farming at Jan Shikshan Sansthan Mamit.

V. EPF and PFMS Update:

The EPF (Employee Provident Fund) process for JSS staff was successful, and the deposit of money is awaited. Additionally, JSS Zero-Balance account PFMS was added in the portal, and approval is currently awaited.

The sub-training, Jss Mamit was monitored by the Directorate of JSS, New Delhi through video conferencing. This allowed for effective supervision and ensured the quality of training.

VII. On-Field Training on 14th and 28th June:

On 14th June, on-field training was provided for the Electrical Technician course at KTP and the Pickle Making Technician course at Hmunsam. On 28th June, training was given for the Electrical Technician course at PYD, Mizo Veng.

VIII. Meeting with DC and SDC, Mamit:

On 28th June, a meeting was held with the District Commissioner (DC) and Sub-Divisional Commissioner (SDC) of Mamit. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the upcoming training programs on Beauty Therapist and Carpenter Wooden Furniture under the Aspirational District Program.

IX. Assessment Marks Update in the Portal:

The assessment marks were updated in the portal; however, the certificate generation process is currently pending.

X. Enrollment for Additional Target:

Throughout the month, enrollment for an additional target of 900 beneficiaries was done.

Now 18 years old, Lalpekhlui is financially independent as an assistant dress maker and stayed out from the orphanage home and is on her way to achieved her dreams of becoming successful Dress Maker.





Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) scheme is implemented with 100% grants from Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Government of India. Under the aegis of Mission Foundation Movement as a parent society, Jan Shikshan Sansthan is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The affairs of Jan Shikshan Sansthan are managed by respective Board of Management approved by the Government of India.

At present 304 JSSs are function in the country. The annual coverage of the beneficiaries is around 4lakh, out of which 85% are women. The programme is based on the polyvalent or multi-dimensional approach and implemented at Mamit District. Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) offers more than 60 job roles



General Duty Assistant (GDA) Course

In the month of June, students were engaged with theoretical and practical classes and unit tests were conducted every Friday to evaluate their knowledge. Nursing procedures were demonstrated in the laboratory and students were made to give return demonstration to assess their level of understanding.

As part of their work education, students were placed three days per week in the evening for cleaning the school premises and hostel. Work distribution and allotment were also made by the students under the supervision of warden which enhances leadership qualities and teamwork among them. Every Sunday students conducted church service in the Conference Hall where students are asked to deliver short sermon and perform special items which is found to have beneficial effect in boosting their confidence.

The Officials from Mizoram Building and Other Construction Worker Welfare Board Member, LESDE Dept. visited the training centre on 27th June and were quite satisfied with the educational and hostel facilities provided to the students.
