## INSPECTION AND FREE CLINIC AT KHAMRANG

An inspection team from Social Welfare and Tribal Affairs Department visited Khamrang Community Health Clinic on 18th September and had an interaction with the clinic and MFM staffs. The inspection was in response to MFM's request to Social Welfare Dept. regarding the pending funds for running the Clinic.

A free clinic was organized on the same day with a total of 98 patients receiving medical aid. Dr Rualthankhuma Renthlei and Dr N Beipierona along with staffs and students from Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy and MFM School of Nursing administered treatment and gave out free medicine.





## JAPANESE LANGUAGE CLASS STARTS



Japanese Language Training Course was introduced at MFM School of Nursing and classes commenced on 10 September, 2023. The course is introduced in collaboration with Kobe University, Japan who have signed a MoU with MFM.

## MFM SCHOOL OF NURSING EXAM RESULTS DECLARED



Results of General Nursing & Midwifery (GNM) Course and Auxiliary Nurse & Midwives (ANM)/Health Worker Course Examination conducted by the Mizoram Nursing Council in the month of August 2023 was declared on 5th October, 2023.

MFM School of Nursing had a 100 percentage pass rate, with Lalruatfeli from the second year finishing third in Mizoram.

## Mobile Dispensary at Belkhai and Dapchhuah

## START UP ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME - SEDP - SUCCESS STORIES



### PC LALREMRUATA

PC Lalremruata is 42 years old hailing from Reiek Village, Mamit District. He was selected for poultry trade under SEDP. His main occupation is poultry farming and is the main supplier of poultry in Reiek and neighboring village. Apart from poultry, he utilizes poultry waste as fertilizers on his horticulture farm which is a good source of nutrients for the crops, crops are also used as poultry food for sustainability.

Under this project, the equipment's in aid supplied by Mission Foundation Movement were used efficiently and has improved a lot from this project. He express his sincere gratitude to mission foundation movement for making his family's financial status secure and stable and as well as for helping him to achieve a huge improvement in his occupation.



### LALMALSAWMSANGI

Lalmalsawmsangi was living in North Kanghmun Village, their main occupation is farming, she helped her parents in Jhuming cultivation. She found that only jhuming cultivation would not uplift the standard of her life and family. She think of alternative to switch from his normal works.

After she was selected as a New Entrepreneur under start-up Entrepreneurship Development Programme she undergo Tailoring Training under private firm, she was a fast learner and within a short period of time she had managed to gain the skill up to a productive level. She now started her business from her home. She was able to support her family and improved their family status through Training and Equipment received from the project.



## ABOUT THE PROJECT

SEDP aims to benefit the households and communities even beyond the financial gains it provides. It seek to help rural people specially the marginalized sections, women, and SC and ST communities to gain a sense of dignity and self- reliance leading to great social changes. The overall objective of SEDP is to implement the Government's efforts to stimulate economic growth and reduce poverty and unemployment in the villages by helping start and support rural enterprises. The project was implemented at Reiek RD Block covering 21 villages with 300 beneficiaries



## STUDENTS MOBILISATION FOR PERMANENT MAKEUP AND WOODEN CARPENTRY

JSS staffs organized a mobilization programme for students to participate in the Permanent Makeup and Wooden Carpentry programs. The programme involves promotion, explaining their benefits, and encouraging students to enroll through whatsapp, local newspaper.
