I extend my sincere gratitude to our team, partners, beneficiaries, and supporters for their invaluable contributions.







Mobilization:

Effective mobilization is crucial for reaching the target audience and ensuring maximum participation in skill development programs. By engaging community leaders and NGOs like the Young Mizo Association (YMA) and Mizo Hmeichhe Insuihkhawm Pawl (MHIP), JSS Mamit tapped into community networks. These existing organizations often have deep-rooted connections within their communities, making them valuable partners in spreading





awareness and facilitating program participation. By leveraging these networks, JSS Mamit was able to identify specific skill needs and demands within the community, ensuring that their skill training programs were tailored to address these requirements. This approach not only increased the relevance of the programs but also enhanced their effectiveness by catering directly to the community's needs.

Awareness:

Conducting awareness programs at schools and colleges is a proactive approach to instilling the importance of skill development in the younger generation. By targeting educational institutions, JSS Mamit reached a large and influential audience, including students who are at a crucial stage of making career decisions. These awareness programs likely included informative sessions, workshops, and interactive activities





aimed at highlighting the benefits of acquiring skills and the various opportunities available through skill development initiatives. By fostering a culture of skill development early on, JSS Mamit aims to inspire and empower the next generation to pursue their goals with confidence and competence.

Career Mela:



Organizing a Career Mela in collaboration with the District Education Office provided a platform for individuals to explore different career paths and gain insights into skill development opport



skill development opportunities. These events typically feature exhibitions, seminars, and interactive sessions where attendees can interact with

industry experts, trainers, and representative sessions will industry experts, trainers, and representatives from various vocational training programs. By partnering with the District Education Office, JSS Mamit ensured a broader reach and access to resources, maximizing the impact of the Career Mela. Such events not only inform individuals about potential career options but also serve as a bridge between job seekers and skill development initiatives, facilitating connections and opportunities for personal and professional growth.



Day-NULM:

In order to promote sustainable livelihoods and address urban poverty under the National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM). JSS Mamit in collaboration with MFM (parent organization) DRDO, Mamit implemented the Skill Development Project focusing on training in Self-Employed Tailoring and Baking Technician skills for a duration of 45 days in August 2023. And another batch in January 2024 in Self-Employed Tailoring, Baking Technician and Domestic Data entry operator with a batch size of 45 each.



A Project Under Niti- Aayog:

The project titled "*Enhancing Employability through Skill Development Training among Youth in Mamit District*" was launched with the primary goal of equipping the youth in Mamit District with marketrelevant skills to enhance their employability. This initiative was spearheaded by the Office of the Deputy Commissioner, Mamit district, in collaboration with



Mission Foundation Movement (MFM), a recognized NSDC Training Provider under NITI Aayog Window-1. The project focused on providing skill development training in job roles identified under the Beauty & Wellness and Furniture & Fittings Skill Councils, namely Assistant Beauty Therapist and Carpenter Wooden Furniture.

A significant challenge observed in many skill training programs is that upon completion, trainees often lack the necessary equipment and materials to kickstart their own ventures. This project sought to address this issue by not only imparting essential skills but also providing beneficiaries with basic equipment. This support aimed to enable them to utilize their training



effectively and embark on livelihood opportunities.

Through this project, the goal was not just to train individuals but to empower them with the means to apply their newfound skills practically, thereby fostering self-reliance and economic independence within the community.

The practical assessment was conducted on 20th October 2023 and 27th October 2023 for Beauty and Wellness and Carpenter Wooden furniture respectively, aimed to evaluate participants' application of acquired skills through hands-on tasks, and real-world scenarios, facilitated by appointed staff of Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Mamit.



The Certification and Equipment Distribution event was held on the 20th of December 2023 at the I&PR Auditorium, Field Veng, Mamit, under the chairmanship of Pu H. Darhmingliana. Ten (10) beneficiaries were certified in Carpentry, while fifteen (15) beneficiaries were certified in Beauty and Wellness.

Following the training, 19 beneficiaries, i.e., 76% secured employment opportunities in local businesses or initiated their own ventures, thereby enhancing their economic prospects and contributing to community development.





Review Meeting:

The review meetings conducted by Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Mamit throughout the financial year of 2023-2024 played a crucial role in monitoring and enhancing the progress of the Skill Development Project. Here's a breakdown of each review meeting:

Online Review Meeting - June 2023:
