1. Students Mobilisation for Permanent Makeup and Wooden Carpentry:

2. Mobilization of Beneficiaries for JSS FY 2023-24:

Undertook the process of mobilizing beneficiaries for JSS for the fiscal year 2023-24. Successfully enrolled 600 beneficiaries for 12 job-roles.

3. Carrier Drive on 10th and 11th August:

Participated in a carrier drive conducted by Deputy Commissioner Office Mamit at Govt. Mamit College and Chhimveng YMA Hall on the 10th and 11th of August respectively. This likely included career guidance sessions and interactive sessions to guide students about potential career paths.
