Assessment on several job roles such as Food Processing and Preservation (JSS Training Centre, Mamit), Assisstant Jute Craft Maker (JSS Training Centre, Mamit), Assisstant Hand Embroidery(JSS Training Centre, Lungsir) and Helper Welder and Fabricator (JSS Training Centre, Kawrthah) had been successfully conducted in different Training Centres. Under the PMKVY 4.0 (Skill Hub Initiatives), another current project, activation of biometric devices and candidates registration on Central Skill Indian Portal which is required for biometric attendance were also done.

Meeting with Executive Director, MFM and Project Coordinator, MFM took place on 19th April at JSS Office. In this meeting, report on JSS action plan and PMKVY 4.0 was given by Assistant programme officer, JSS and motivational speech regarding improvement on office work was also delivered by the Executive Director, MFM. On the date of 26th, inspection of Training Centre for PMKVY 4.0 from National Skill Development Council(NSDC) was conducted and inspection of Training Centre for the job role of Baking Technician and Self Employed Tailor which are to be held under DAY NULM also took place on the next day.

Training has been going-on for different job-roles for additional target of 2022-2023 at various identified training centres of different villages. At the same time, identification of training centres and enrollment of beneficiaries is proceeding simulteneously.
