MFM SCHOOL OF NURSING (ANM & GNM)

MFM School of Nursing was established in the year 2009 with approval from the Indian Nursing Council and Mizoram Nursing Council. The college was awarded a GNM status in 2024 with an intake capacity of 20 seats for ANM and 30 seats for GNM per batch.

The students are acquainted with current skills and knowledge on medical fields boosted with professional expertise to meet the changing demand of the society.

Health workers play an important role in rendering primary healthcare services in rural areas even with minimum health care facility with the other health team members.

Being the grass root healthcare provider especially for rural areas, the importance of services rendered by Health workers is irrefutable.



LAITHANGPUII COLLEGE OF PHARMACY

Laithangpuii College of Pharmacy, founded in 2014, holds the distinction of being Mizoram's first pharmacy college. With an annual intake of 60 students, it is affiliated with both the State Council for Technical Education and the Pharmacy Council of India. Pharmacists play a crucial role in the healthcare system by dispensing medications and offering up-to-date drug information.

The institution also undertakes research and studies focused on medicinal plants and food products, aiming to enhance health standards. Equipped with modern laboratory facilities, the college aspires to make a significant impact on the pharmaceutical profession, particularly in Northeast India. Students from across the states are encouraged to join and participate in its programs.



MFM COMMUNITY HEALTH CLINIC AT KHAMRANG

Many villages in Mizoram do not have basic health care facilities which create a dire need of health workers, nurses and doctors in rural areas. Recognizing this need, MFM opened a Health Clinic at Khamrang Village in 2012, with the approval from the Health Department, Govt. of Mizoram, covering a population of 3086 in five villages nearby Khamrang village.

The clinic is a 10 bedded hospital with one delivery bed. Conducting health awareness, rendering health services, health teachings, environment and sanitation awareness programmes in the villages are the various involvements we had with the community. The clinic works to improve the health of mothers and their children, community health, sanitation.

In 2015 a new building was funded by the Embassy of Japan in New Delhi. It was inaugurated by Mr Akio Isomata Economic Minister, Embassy of Japan and Chief Minister of Mizoram on 4th of April 2016. Maintenance of the clinic is funded by Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt. of India.



COVID-19 VACCINATION

MOMENTUM Routine Immunization Transformation and Equity project was funded by United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and was awarded to John Snow Inc (JSI) in 2020.

To ramp up COVID-19 vaccination with the objective to increase demand, distribution and uptake of COVID-19 vaccination particularly among the vulnerable and marginalized population in Mizoram, Mission Foundation Movement was sub-awarded the project by JSI on February, 2022 to be one among the 24 identified sub-awardee spread across various states in India.

Mission Foundation Movement covers the following area-

- 1) Kolasib District: Thingdawl RD Block, Bilkhawthlir RD Block
- 2) Mamit District: Zawnuam RD Block, West Phaileng RD Block, Reiek RD Block
- 3) Lunglei District: Lunglei RD Block, Lungsen RD Block, Hnahthial RD Block, Bungmun RD Block.



The organization successfully implemented the government special campaign such as Har Ghar Dastak 2.0 and Amrit Mahotsav. In extension, to leverage the vaccine coverage, Har Office Dastak and Har School Dastak were also implemented.

To increase COVID-19 Vaccination awareness among the community, door-door mobilization, community involvement recreational activities such as folklore, football tournament, wall paintings and animated video awareness were circulated in local languages.

To vaccinate the hard-to-reach areas, mobile express are engaged in the entire district. Vulnerable population such as Bru, Chakma and refugees were vaccinated through this mobile express. Through this project, more than 15,000 doses of COVID-19 vaccine were already administered.



EDUCATION

We provide Non-formal education to children from low income communities in South eastern parts of Mizoram bordering Burma and Bangladesh in two Districts namely Lawngtlai and Lunglei District among the tribes such as Bawm, Bru, Chakma and Khumi.

Our Initiative includes opening pre-school (3-6 years) and Non Formal Education (6- 14 years) for non-school going children. We work to impart education for children in need who are under difficult circumstances due to financial constraints. Special emphasis is given to girls' education for their empowerment.



SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING & PLACEMENT - PRADHAN MANTRI KAUSHAL VIKAS YOJANA (PMKVY)

It is a flagship scheme of the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) implemented by National Skill Development Corporation. The objective of this Skill Certification Scheme is to enable a large number of Indian youth to take up industry-relevant skill training that will help them in securing a better livelihood.

A) Central Sponsored State Monitor: Managed by Labour, Employment, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (LESDE) Department, Govt. of Mizoram, MFM is one of the Training Provider (TP) under this scheme since 2016. Under this project, we work at the following sector:

Healthcare Sector
Construction Sector
Electronics Sector
Apparel Made-Ups and Home Furnishing Sector
Tourism and Hospitality sector

B) Special Project – Aspirational District (MAMIT)

The special project under PMKVY 2.0 is a Central Sponsored Central Monitor scheme which is specially focused on aspirational districts that need intensive attention to leverage India's demographic dividend. It aims to eliminate poverty and offer the underprivileged section of the society a better chance to live a life of dignity and respect. As an attempt to integrate villages into the development process of the country, MFM works with Mamit, an aspirational district in Mizoram under these sectors:

Tourism and Hospitality
Food Industry Capacity & Skill Initiative
Beauty & Wellness
Electronics Sector

A number of youths in Mamit had benefited from this scheme redressing inequalities based on gender bias, caste/class, and economic disparities.



RURAL YOUTH SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING & PLACEMENT - DEEN DAYAL UPADHYAYA GRAMEEN KAUSHALYA YOJANA (DDUGKY)

Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDUGKY) is a scheme under Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD), Govt. of India and a part of the National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM), tasked with the dual objectives of adding diversity to the incomes of rural poor families and cater to the career aspirations of rural youth. It focused on rural youth between the ages of 15 and 35 years from poor families.

Sharing similar vision to transform rural poor youth into an economically independent and globally relevant workforce, MFM is empanelled as a Project Implementing Agency (PIA) from 2019.



We opened our Training Centre at Berawtlang, Aizawl. Furnishing with the best facility, the centre is looked after by qualified, devoted Staffs and Trainers to ensure the best learning outcome with job placement facilities within, outside states and overseas.

RURAL LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMME: START UP VILLAGE ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAM (SVEP)

The Start up Village Entrepreneurship Program (SVEP) is a sub component of Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana – National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM) of the Ministry of Rural Development. SVEP aims to support entrepreneurs in rural areas to set up local enterprises. It strives to help the rural poor come out of poverty by helping them set up enterprises and provide support till the enterprises stabilize. The programmatic intervention addresses all three missing ecosystems – Knowledge, advisory and finance ecosystems.

As an empanelled Project Implementing Agency (PIA), we started implementing it from 2019. we covered the whole district of Kolasib with as many as 800 Target beneficiaries



WOMEN EMPOWERMENT THROUGH RURAL LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMME

Joining hands with the Partners world wide, USA, we worked closely and vigorously to empower women by helping them set-up a sustainable livelihood. The importance for improvement of rural women conditions and status is a well known fact.

Moreover, financial dependency on family members further depreciates women's status. With the aim to economically empower women, we promote Piggery Farming with over 70 women in the Rural site of Aizawl. This project was initiated from 2019. This initiative vision to increase women's self-confidence, provide better status and role in household.



HIV PROJECT

HIV/AIDS a lifelong condition and currently a no cure disease is a worldwide issue. Unfortunately, Mizoram is one of the most affected areas. As a result, MFM partnering with I Tech (University of Washington) USA step forward to diminish the present status and improve the current situation of people infected with the disease. MFM encompass FHI 360's comprehensive approach to fighting HIV and AIDS driven by innovative research, aggregated evidence and a long track record of engaging directly with communities. As a Project Implementing Agency (PIA), we dedicate ourselves to crafting solutions that respond to the multifaceted nature of HIV and AIDS.

The project is been implemented in Kolasib and Mamit which have the highest number of people infected with the disease. We work closely with the Target Intervention (TI) NGO for the prevention and identification of key population. We employ the 90-90-90 strategies through approaches grounded in principles of human rights, mutual respect and inclusion.



SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR UNEMPLOYED YOUTH - HSBC SKILLS FOR LIFE - SWADES FOUNDATION

With the aim to reduce poverty and inequality, HSBC Swadesh Foundation come up with the most powerful instrument: skill development. HSBC started an initiative to provide access to education and livelihood, particularly for young people from disadvantaged backgrounds. In line with the central focus of the project, MFM is selected as a Training Provider (TP) since 2017. We imparted training in General Duty Assistant (GDA), Healthcare Sector to enhance capacities of rural and urban disadvantaged young women to improve their livelihood potential and provide employment opportunities. Currently, we have our centre at Aizawl with 360 target beneficiaries.



HSBC Skills for Life is a five year commitment by HSBC India that will focus on employment and entrepreneurship-linked skill development of disadvantaged youth. Under the umbrella of this programme, the Bank and Swades Foundation have forged a five-year partnership that will directly skill many thousand disadvantaged youth across the country and indirectly impact and inspire many others.

WORKING WOMEN HOSTEL

With the progressive change in the socio-economic fabric of the country, more and more women are leaving their homes in search of employment in big cities as well as urban and rural industrial clusters. One of the main difficulties faced by such women is lack of safe and conveniently located accommodation. Realizing this need, MFM constructed Working Women Hostel at Durtlang, with the objective to promote availability of safe and conveniently located accommodation for working women, including day care facility for their children. The hostel was funded by Ministry of Women and Child, Government of India. The hostel building can accommodate 100 of residence with 30 Day Care Centre.

The beneficiaries embrace single, widowed, divorced, separated, and married but whose husband or immediate family does not reside in the same city/area, women who are under training for job and girls up to the age of 18 years and boys up to the age of 5 years accompanying their mother.



START-UP ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (SEDP)

It has been realized that in the absence of adequate business skills like understanding of market, domain knowledge, accounting, costing skills and lack of financial support, micro/nano enterprises struggle to survive and often either fail or become stagnant generating sub optimal incomes. The plight increases in case of the poor as they do not have linkages with financial institutions.

In order to solve this problem and to provide support to small enterprises and skill based workers, both in terms of training and credit support, in the Budget session of 2014-15 on July 10th, 2014 the Honorable Finance Minister initiated the idea of Start-up village entrepreneurship programme. The project will provide assistant to existing enterprises at the same time encourage development of new enterprises.



SEDP aims to benefit the households and communities even beyond the financial gains it provides. It seek to help rural people specially the marginalized sections, women, and SC and ST communities to gain a sense of dignity and self- reliance leading to great social changes. The overall objective of SEDP is to implement the Government's efforts to stimulate economic growth and reduce poverty and unemployment in the villages by helping start and support rural enterprises.

The project was implemented at Reiek RD Block covering 21 villages with 300 beneficiaries



JAN SHIKSHAN SANSTHAN (JSS)

MFM operate the only JSS programme for Mizoram at Mamit District. Under this programme, a skill development NSQF with 3-5 courses has been conducted. We expect to train 1800 trainees within this year. We have 4 Training Centre and we are collaborating with various government agencies and Department. This Programme is funded by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt, of India.



DESTINATION BASED SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING

Skill Testing and Certification under the scheme Hunar Se Rozgar Tak is under the Ministry of Tourism, GOI implemented by Mission Foundation Movement at Lunglei, Aizawl and Reiek where we offered three different job roles namely; F&R Service Steward, Home Stay Multi-skill caretaker and Bakery to enhance employable skills at required destination bases. There were 168 certified trainees who completed this training.



SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAINING FOR SPECIAL GROUPS

A) Centralized Skill Training for Migrant workmen:

A training programme for Migrant workers was organized in February 2020 in different courses like Baking Technician, Nail Technician and Entrepreneurship. A total of 60 trainees completed the course with flying colours. Certificate and stipend was provided during their training.

B) Aluminium Training at Central Jail:

In collaboration with Mizoram Youth Commission, a training programme in Aluminium was carried out in Central Jail. 50 inmates successfully completed this training which we hope will give them the opportunity to earn a livelihood in the future. This programme is funded by NFC



MFM RELIEF PROJECT FOR MYANMAR REFUGEES

Mission Foundation Movement is taking several steps to provide Relief and Aid for the Myanmar Refugees living in Mizoram. As of March 2022, an estimated 30,443 refugees from Myanmar are currently living in Mizoram. MFM staffs have visited several camps and have collected important data to help create a sustainable livelihood for these refugees.

An estimated 2,800 families live in various refugee camps and 4,814 families live with their relatives across all districts of Mizoram. These refugees lack the basic necessities for their daily lives. They desperately need food, water, shelter, and medical care. Mission Foundation Movement is planning to conduct more surveys at other Refugee camps in the near future. Plans are ongoing to organize free clinics at various camps sites located in Aizawl, Mamit, Lunglei and Kolasib Districts respectively. We are currently partnered with Nations UK and Chin Humanitarian Aid International.



COVID CRASH COURSE - "UNITED TO FIGHT AGAINST CORONA"

Under Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt of India, we offered a Covid Crash course to Covid Frontline Workers during the height of the Covid Pandemic.

Our Volunteers were at the forefront of the fight against the pandemic at various Dedicated Covid Centers across Mizoram.



MOBILE DISPENSARY

MFM has undertaken the Mobile Dispensary Unit under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt, of India. The programme was implemented at Mamit District since 2017 which is an aspirational district driven by the need to make health care facilities more accessible and reasonable.

As an aspirational district by Central Government, the community needs extra care to improve the welfare of the local tribal people. Public health is the strategy of enhancing and safeguarding the state of the overall well-being of communities and people, free medical health check-up and health awareness programme was organized mainly for the minority tribe and vulnerable sections of the community. The programme helps to foster the socioeconomic development and overall growth of the Scheduled Tribes.



ORGANIC FARMING

The pandemic hampers normal lifestyle including food Production and Vegetables supply chain. To mitigate this we have Implemented Organic Farming for Sustainable Agriculture Production Project to promote self-sufficient in agricultural Products and ensure continuous supply of vegetables in the city.

As an empanelled Project Implementing Agency, We started from February 2022, covering the entire RD block of Thingsulthiah RD and Reiek RD Block with as many as 150 Self Help Group (SHG). In this project, 150 beneficiaries i.e., 75 from Reiek and 75 from Thingsulthiah RD block respectively are selected.



RRTC FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

The main objective of the Programme is to improve the quality of the Senior Citizens, especially indigent senior citizen by providing basic amenities like shelter, food, medical care and entertainment opportunities and by encouraging productive and active ageing through providing support for capacity building of State, Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and the community at large. RRTCs are expected to be key collaborating partners for ensuring effective implementation of the policies and programmes of the Ministry.

We are covering 4 states in North East India - Mizoram, Assam, Meghalaya & Arunachal Pradesh

The Programme is 100% funded by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt of India



PROJECT PLANT 10,000 TREES BY 2025 IN SCHOOL

This project is the initiatives of Mission Foundation Movement with a vision to create green spaces and urban orchards, improving air quality, and providing habitat for wildlife. Planting fruit trees in schools is an investment in the future. As the trees mature and bear fruit, they will continue to provide educational, environmental, and nutritional benefits for years to come, leaving a lasting legacy for current and future generations of students.

The 10,000 Fruit Tree Project represents a holistic approach to addressing pressing socio-economic and environmental challenges through community-led action in collaboration with schools within the urban areas.

By planting fruit-bearing trees, we not only contribute to the health and resilience of ecosystems but also cultivate a sense of belonging and empowerment among individuals and communities. Through sustained effort and collective engagement, we can create a greener, healthier, and more sustainable future for generations to come.



The organization tie up with more than 500 schools in and around the urban setting of Aizawl, Mizoram and the plantation of fruit trees in the school areas is going on.



BAMBOO CRAFT TRAINING UNDER SANKALP

Skill Acquisition and Knowledge Awareness for Livelihood Promotion (“SANKALP”) is a programme under Ministry of Skill Development with loan assistance from the World Bank. It aims to improve short term skill-training qualitatively and quantitatively through strengthening institutions, bring in better market connectivity and inclusion of marginalised sections of the society. SANKALP was launched on 19th January 2018 and has a tenure till March 2023.

Under SANKALP programme, Horticulture Department, Mamit proposed a skill development project for implementation in Mamit District named “Short Term Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Training of Youth for Livelihood Promotion in Horticulture Crops”.

In collaboration with Horticulture Department, Mamit and Mission Foundation Movement (MFM) implemented the Skill Development Training at Mamit and Reiek under the umbrella of Mamit DC. The project focuses on promoting Mizoram products to encourage local artisans and promote value addition in existing products, items and to introduce innovative products/handicrafts using the locally available resources, raw materials like bamboos.



JAPANESE LANGUAGE COURSE

A six months Japanese Language Course was started in September 2023 at MFM School of Nursing Building. A MoU was signed with Kobe International University (Japan) under which MFM School of Nursing students who have passed this course will be able to work in Japan. Admission will be open for General students (not only Nursing) in 2024. Through Technical Intern Training Program (TITP) and Specialized Skilled Workers scheme, Successful Japanese Language trainees will have the opportunity to work in Japan.



MOBIUS YOUNG CLIMATE LEADERS FOR HIMALAYAN DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

Mobius Young Climate Leaders for Himalayan Development Project led by the Climate Studies and Knowledge Solutions Centre, Government of Nagaland with support from the Department of Environment Forest and Climate Change and Nagaland Board of Secondary Education (NBSE) and the Hearth Advisors. The project being implemented by YouthNet is being generously supported by the Mobius Foundation through visionary leadership of Shri Pradip Burman, the Honourable Chairman of the Foundation. MOBIUS YOUNG PROFESSIONALS PROGRAM under the project was launched where Forestry and Environment graduates have been selected and trained to undertake the three key components of the project.

The Project was launched in Mizoram in 2025 with MFM as the Project Implementing Agency.



MOBILE MEDICAL UNIT

With the objective of extending healthcare access to the most vulnerable communities in Mamit Aspirational District, Mizoram, we are collaborating with TATA AIG General Insurance and Swasti Health Catalyst to implement a Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) initiative. Mamit, being one of the Aspirational Districts of India, continues to face significant challenges in healthcare delivery due to its remote terrain, scattered villages, and limited infrastructure. Many communities in the district remain underserved, with restricted access to essential health services and facilities.

The MMU project seeks to bridge this gap by bringing primary healthcare directly to hard-to-reach and marginalized populations. It will not only address the immediate health needs of the people but also complement and strengthen the existing healthcare system of the district. By working in close coordination with the health department, this initiative aims to improve health outcomes, enhance service delivery, and ensure that the most vulnerable populations in Mamit are not left behind in accessing quality healthcare.
