On 26 February, they attended Care Show Japan 2026 to explore collaboration opportunities in the healthcare and care sectors.

On 27 February, a strategic meeting was held with Konoike Group to discuss employment opportunities under the Specified Skilled Worker (SSW) programme, particularly in the truck driving sector. Follow-up discussions were agreed upon.
